In the past many months, there has been a lot of chatter about vaccines. Each effective vaccine is a miracle. Each vaccine gives people hope that they could avoid a particular sickness. But even with the most effective vaccine, humanity has the same mortality rate. To date, every person has a mortality rate of 100 percent. We all have the same fate: death. This is because the wages of sin is death, and since all have sinned, all will die (Romans 6:23a).

Even with the certainty of death on the horizon, the life of the Christian does not end at death. You see, Jesus offers everyone the free gift of eternal life through the medicine of immortality. Jesus says to us, "**Whoever feeds on My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on My flesh and drinks my blood abides in Me, and I in him**" (John 6:54-56).

As sinner-saints, we need this medicine weekly in the Divine Service, as we constantly need forgiveness for our sins and our Christian faith strengthened. This is what God does for us as He serves us — His flock — each and every Sunday.

This medicine of immortality is the greatest gift we could ever receive. This Christ offers to us freely and out of His abounding love for you!

## ANGEL SEEDS



Blizzard Blast, an annual Allina Hospice Foundation fundraiser has been selected as the Angel Seeds recipient from April through June. This event brings in thousands of dollars in donations that are used to support patients with massage and music therapy services, which are not reimbursed by Medicare or private insurance.

In case you're wondering why massage and music therapy are important — massage therapy can help to manage a patient's pain, reduce stress, and improve circulation. Music therapy provides physical, emotional, and social comfort. Both services are led by certified therapists and therapy sessions are individualized to provide comfort for each patient.

While many think of hospice in terms of a building, it's not a place, but an end-of-life care philosophy. The object is to treat the whole person, not just the disease. The emphasis is on comfort care and quality of life.

Many people are not aware that hospice services are available wherever a patient chooses to live. That means services can be delivered at home, in an assisted-living facility, hospital or a nursing home.

Others believe hospice services are only available for people with cancer. That's also not true. It's for any patient with a terminal illness.

A team of professionals and volunteers work with the patient and family to carry out their wishes. Hospice care also offers support for caregivers during the illness and grief support after the death.

Allina Health Home Care provides hospice services within an hour's travel leaving from Hutchinson or Glencoe.

## What is relational ministry?

The concept of relational ministry is simple: relationships are at the heart of true conversion.

We cannot do this unless we are willing to meet the teens where they are at, develop healthy relationships, and walk with them

closer to Christ. It is possibly the most important and most difficult aspect of youth ministry.

Quite often, I receive questions like, "Why go out to eat with youth?" or "Why is it important to go to their activities?"

Everything I have learned from being a DCE for about 7 years is that meeting people where they are in life is important. When we look at what Jesus did in His ministry on earth, we see him meeting in their homes over meals. His teachings are intimate. Take Zaccheus, for example; when Jesus asks him to come down from the tree, he gets invited into his home, and that's where he talks to him about how he is living his life. When a youth asks to go out and chat normally, it's because they need advice, guidance, prayer, and someone with a willing ear to listen. There is a purpose for what is being done. My role is to help guide them in their faith life and help them have hard conversations with parents or friends. Some of these meetings have led to the youth seeking counseling or even doing a 1 on 1 Bible study with me. I am here to say that I am here for you, as a youth, as an adult, or even as a parent. I want to take the time to get to know you to walk with you and encourage you along in your faith journey. There are 4 keyways I think about when connecting with our members:

Level 1: Contact (everyone)- Engage with everyone, know their name, and remember it!

Level 2: Connect (most)- Although we can make contact with all people, we will connect with a smaller group. At this level, we look for a common basis on which a relationship can grow. This involves showing interest in their lives, going out for meals, etc.

Level 3: Care (some)- As much as I want to provide care for anyone and everyone, some people desire and some that don't. You know something about their lives, and there is trust and respect between you and the youth. This requires active listening, approaching parents, etc.

Level 4: Challenge (a few)- At this level, we have gained the trust of the teens and have earned the right to be heard. This is where you can speak truth into their lives, challenge them to take leadership positions, and be ready for their hard questions.

If you feel equipped to do relational ministry, I'd love to chat with you about getting involved.

I have used this reference for many of my core beliefs on relational ministry.




## RADIO BROADCAST of First Lutheran Services

How does it work?


**Phone Chain** – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning on down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain.

**E-Mail Chain** – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.
