A Series of Special Sunday Services for Advent and for Christmas Eve

Christmas is a season of light. Lights are everywhere-outlining the rooflines and windows of homes, shining softly on Advent wreath candles, and sparkling in bright colors on Christmas trees. We enjoy the lights, but those same colorful decorations remind us that we need the light. Our world is often a very dark place, and not just after sunset. The darkness- of sin and guilt, violence and fear-often threatens to overwhelm us. But God sent His Son into the world to be its Light, to be our Light. During Advent we celebrate the fact that the Light has come and we look forward to the day when Jesus our Light will come again and "night will be no more" (Revelation 22:5).

On our Sundays in Advent this year, we prepare to welcome the Christ Child, Jesus, who is the Light of the World. In celebration, we, in turn, shine with the light of Christ in various ways for all the world to see the brightness of his love. Each week will focus on a different aspect of the light of Christ and how we are enlightened by him throughout our lives. The theme verse for the entire series is: "Arise, shine, for your light has come" (Isaiah 60:1).

Week 1 (November 27th): Rising Light (Isaiah 60:1) In our worship for the first week in Advent we will celebrate the rising light. Living in the light of Jesus, we prepare to celebrate his birth. Repenting of our sins, we put away the works of darkness and dress in the armor of light.

Week 2 (December 4th): Reflected Light (Zechariah 9:16) In our worship for the second week in Advent we will celebrate Jesus as the Light of the world and how we reflect his light in our daily lives.

Week 3 (December 11^h): Healing Light (Malachi 4:2) In our worship for the third week in Advent with repentant joy we anticipate the birth of our Savior. We listen to his Word and live according to it until he comes again.

Week 4 (December 18th): Eternal Light (Daniel 12:3) In our worship for the fourth week in Advent we look forward to Jesus' Second Advent, when we will be raised in glory to live in his presence and shine like stars forever.

Christmas Eve (Saturday, December 24th at 2 PM, 5PM, and 7 PM): Glorious Light (Isaiah 9:2) This night we celebrate the glorious light that filled the dark sky over Bethlehem and the glory of the Lord revealed in the Christ Child born to us. Candlelight, carols, Scripture, a message, and prayers reveal the Good News that the

Light of the World has come. With shepherds and angels, let us rejoice!

Please join us again on **Christmas Morning, Sunday, December 25**th **at 9 AM** as we once more celebrate the birth of the Lord in the Divine Service with Holy Communion, and we will hear more Good News of the birth of Jesus Christ, who is the Light of the World!


We encourage members of the congregation to join the Altar Guild at any time. If you see us working after the worship services, we invite you to join us and see what we are up to.


16th Annual FLS Silent Auction & Meal

First Ev. Lutheran Still Serves Funeral Meals

Many congregations have discontinued serving funeral meals. Some congregations have only catered funerals. Here at First Evangelical Lutheran in Glencoe funeral meals are still served by church members. Women from "Lutheran Women in Mission" LWML will work with you and the funeral home to serve a funeral meal of your choice. Most families choose to purchase a hotdish/casserole or cold cuts and bread from a local store or restaurant. We will make the sandwiches and coffee in the church kitchen. Some families ask their friends and relatives to bring bars, cakes, or salads. We will serve them for you.

We serve buffet-style with four lines. Within a few minutes the entire roomful of guests is served and eating. Your guests who are unable to walk a buffet line will be assisted. You will be free to visit with your funeral guests while we do all of the serving, kitchen clean-up and Fellowship Hall clean-up. Then we will pack up all of your leftovers for you to take home.

Most families pay the funeral home's suggested serving fee. Some families are so appreciative of the service received they give a generous extra donation. You are assured that all of the money received by Lutheran Women in Mission LWML is used for proclaiming Christ here in Glencoe and far away. None of it is used for kitchen up-keep. (There's a different fund for that.) None of it is used frivolously.

Members of First Ev. Lutheran: Are you interested in helping serve funerals?

Call the church office and let us know. You can specify what times work for you. Example: "Not on Tuesdays," "only on weekends," not January-March." You will never work alone and there will be someone in charge to show you what to do. Helping serve funeral meals is a good way for you to show the love of Jesus to your grieving brothers and sisters in Christ.



Lutheran Hour 2023 Rose Parade Float

In keeping with its "Never on Sunday" tradition followed since 1893, the 134th Tournament of Roses Parade will be held on Monday, January 2, 2023, in Pasadena, California, under the theme of "Turning the Corner." The iconic annual parade begins at 8 a.m. Pacific Time.

Lutheran Hour Ministries will participate for the 72nd time with a float entry titled "A New Day with Jesus." A new day is dawning on this year's float, as the sun rises from behind a church and families gather. The steeple directs our eyes upward to the cross of Christ and the stained-glass windows tell the story of how God is making all things new. Jesus stands at the open doors of the church ready to welcome everyone into His fold, where He promises to make Himself known in the gathering of His people, the reading and proclamation of His Word, and participation in His Holy Baptism and Communion. In November, we held two Homegrown meals, continuing to utilize the \$5,000 grant monies awarded from the MN



Department of Agriculture Farm to School program! These grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program.

On November 3, we had a delicious egg bake that included bacon (from the pig we processed), and potatoes, peppers, and onions (from our school garden). We purchased the eggs from Tangletown Gardens from Plato. Gina also made pumpkin muffins with pumpkins from Mrs. Donnay.

On November 17, Hot Cheesy Chicken Sandwiches were served. The chickens came from the Matt & Shauna Gruber Farm and the buns from Pan-o-Gold Bakery in St. Cloud. Chicken is filled with high-quality proteins and is low in fat. Chicken also contains Vitamin B which fills your body with energy! Our carrot sticks, which were a beautiful yellow color, were from Tangletown Gardens. Our apples came from Shimanski's Orchard in Silver Lake.

After each Homegrown meal, the students are singing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors that we can purchase from. FINANCIAL PRESENTATION

On Monday, November 28th at the Quarterly Voters Meeting the Endowment/Finance Committee provided a financial presentation. The goal of this presentation was to inform congregation members of the current deficit, cash assets, designated funds, and restricted funds.

The General Fund balance has a deficit of - \$154,111. Without the various designated funds "propping up" the checkbook, our checkbook would be in the negative.

This is a real problem.

The designated fund donations were given by donors for a specific purpose and should not be used to cover Operating Expenses. According to the LCMS Church Treasurer's Manual, a church should NEVER borrow from Designated Funds to cover Operating Expenses.

Included below is a copy of the handout that was presented. Additional copies are available at the entrance stands. We're asking you to think and pray about this. We're looking for your ideas and input. Please take time to examine the financials, ask questions, and think of possible solutions. Our next Voter's meeting will be in February, and we hope to share ideas then.

The CHRISMONS that decorate our CHRISTMAS TREE

Chrismon, is a combination of two words: CHRISt and MONogram. A Chrismon is an omament (always in white and gold to symbolize the purity and majesty of the Son of God), which depicts some divine attribute of Christ or reminds one of a divine gift that Christ bestows. The Chrismon Tree is a visual sermon in which the believer sees the blessed message of the Christmas Gospel — that Christ came as man's Savior. It is our hope that this brief description of some of the various symbols used on the omaments will make our ChrismonTree more meaningful.

The earliest symbols for our Savior are *letters* from the Greek alphbet. Examples are:

X -The first letter (chi) of the word Christ.
<u>IHC</u> or <u>IHS</u> -The first three letters of JESus.

 Annotate and Omega, first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. Rev. 22:13 calls Jesus the alpha and omega, the eternal God.

 INRI - an abreviation for the Latin inscription on the Cross, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews". Iesus, Nazarenus, Rex Iudaeorum.

A cross is a reminder of our Lord's sacrifice to redeem us from our sins. The different forms of the cross point to the various aspects of our Saviors's work. Some examples are:

-TAU Cross, salvation promised, but not yet accomplished.

-Cross CROSSLET, the spread of Christanity to the North, East, South and West, to the ends of the earth.

 LATIN or PASSION Cross, cross of suffering; with pointed ends it reminds us of the nails, thoms and spear.

 Cross in GLORY, the rising sun behind the cross symbolizes the new day, when our Lord conquered death by His resurrection.

-Cross TREFLEE, three circles on each of the ends symbolize the Holy Trinity.

-GREEK or LORD'S PRAYER Cross.

All four arms of equal length.

Other symbols for our Lord and God include: <u>CIRCLE</u> - eternity, God who is eternal. <u>TRIANGLE</u>, or <u>THREE INTERWOVEN CIRCLES</u>

Our Triune God; the Holy Trinity.
 STAR - symbolizes the close relationship

 symbolizes the close relationship between the birth and death of our Lord; also the prophesy of His coming.

FISH, IXOYC - the Greek word for fish is an acrostic on the first letters of "Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior". The fish was a secret sign used between early Christians during times of persecution.

BUTTERFLY - Symbol of the Lord's Resurrection.

ROSE - Nativity of our Lord. He was called "the Rose of Sharon".



HAND OF GOD - This is perhaps the most outstanding symbol of God the Father. God's hand is extended to give us His blessing and to supply our needs.



LAMB OF GOD - The white pennant represents the body of Christ which is attached to the cruciform staff, representing the cross on which the Lamb of God died and thru which the Risen Christ saves the world. When the Lamb is depicted lying down, reference is made to the suffering Christ. When the Lamb is standing, suggestion is given that the Lamb of God is risen triumphantly.



THE CROWN - The Kingship of our Lord Jesus Christ as He sits at the right hand of the Father and rules over the world and His church on earth. It also can represent the reward of the faithful Christian life.



THE DESCENDING DOVE - The most usual symbol of the Holy Spirit, reminding us of how the Holy Spirit appeared upon Jesus at the time of His baptism by John the Baptist.



THE SHELL on the 8-POINTED STAR The shell is a symbol for Holy Baptism, as
the shell was used for pouring water. The 8
-pointed star is a symbol for the regeneration of the Christian through Baptism.



THE CHALICE & WAFER on 6-POINTED STAR - A symbol of the Lord's Supper. The 6-pointed star is called the Creator's Star, reminding us that thru the Body and Blood of Jesus we are brought back into harmony with God.

THE WHEAT and GRAPES - Another symbol of the Lord's Supper.



THE FIERY CHARIOT - As Elijah ascended into Heaven on the Fiery Chariot, so, this Chrismon reminds us of the Ascension of our Lord and Sevior Jesus Christ.
