What is more, in our Sunday Morning Bible classes, we will dig further into John's Gospel as we study this part of God's Holy Word together and see how it applies to our lives today!

The sermons in our series, "Witnesses to Christ: People from His Passion", begin with John the Baptist on Ash Wednesday and end with Mary Magdalene on Easter. Most of the texts for these messages come from near the end of this Gospel (John 18:1–20:31).

The Bible studies on Sunday mornings all during March and on April 2nd are centered on Jesus' seven signs, or miracles, that appear in the first part of John's Gospel (John 1:19–12:50). What's the connection? The signs prepare us for the promises linked to our Savior's passion, death, and resurrection.

Christ's seven signs take us on a journey beginning with a wedding feast in Cana and ending with the resurrection of Lazarus. Throughout this trip, we will see the incredible events of water turned into wine, a sick boy restored, a lame man brought to his feet, thousands fed, a storm silenced, a blind man gaining sight, and a dead man coming forth from his tomb.

The McLeod Emergency Food Shelf (MEFS) is a non-profit agency which was organized in 1983 to assist residents of McLeod County, Minnesota in the area of hunger relief.

MEFS receives financial donations and food support donations from the individuals, organizations, civic groups, businesses, food rescue partners, and faith partners of McLeod County.

Since 1983, millions of meals have been provided by the generous support of the local community. In the first year, 109 households were served with the number stretching over the years to as many as 1,857 distinct households. More than a half million pounds of food are distributed each year!




First Edition Book Club

FLC Prayer Chain

New members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going! You can join either a Phone or an E-Mail Chain. Participation is simple, but so very powerful! The Bible says in Phil



4:6, "But in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let you request be known to God." Thank you to all of our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit.

How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning on down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain.



Rose Parade Reflections

The opportunity to ride on the Lutheran Hour Ministries float in the Rose Parade on January 2nd

gave me a whole different perspective of the Rose Parade and the incredible float ministry of LHM and the Petal Pushers®. Watching from home or watching from the streets allows one to view the parade, but I had the opportunity to view the parade route from my seat on the float literally in a bed of roses!

And I was not fully prepared for my experience. The first thing that surprised me was how close we were to the crowd. I loved the fact that with only 2.5 mph and stopping frequently, I was able to actually make eye contact with people in the crowd and say "God bless you" or "Happy New Year" and receive a smile and a response. But what truly amazed me was the response from the crowd towards the Lutheran Hour Ministries float. One will never see this watching on TV, but as we would move forward through the parade route, countless people stood, cheered loudly for Jesus, called out the name "Jesus" in various languages, started singing Christian songs and thanked us for having a Christian float in the parade.

I will never forget the enthusiasm of kids coming out of the crowd tugging at their shirts and yelling "I am a Christian too". With an estimated 700,000 people lining the streets, I would say 10's of 1,000's of people had such a reaction, which at least in my estimation makes Jesus the star of the Rose Parade.




DESSERT!

Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

We are pleased to report that we were recently awarded additional grant monies from the MN Department of Agriculture Farm to School program! We will receive \$3282 from the Full Tray and \$3418 from the Second Helping Grants. These grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program. In addition, \$5000 is available under a 50/50 match for equipment purchases under the AGRI Equipment grant program.

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors that we can purchase from. 
