

#### <u>Rev. Dr. Kenneth R. Klaus Called To Glory</u> March 24, 2023 Lutheran Hour Ministries

The Rev. Dr. Kenneth R. Klaus, Speaker Emeritus of The Lutheran Hour® radio program, died March 23 at his home in Texas. He served as Speaker of The Lutheran Hour from 2002 until his retirement



at the end of 2010. Following his retirement as full-time Speaker, he continued recording one sermon a month for The Lutheran Hour before returning as interim Speaker in 2017 and 2018. Using stories, parables, and common-sense messages, Pastor Klaus was known by listeners for one thing: preaching Christ crucified and risen.

In addition to his weekly sermons on The Lutheran Hour, Pastor Klaus initiated the writing and recording of Lutheran Hour Ministries' popular Daily Devotions, a resource that shares God's love in Jesus Christ with readers and listeners worldwide. He also developed and hosted several LHM Bible studies, spoke at conferences and events across the United States and Canada, led ministry tours internationally, and published many works, including volumes one and two of Stories from The Lutheran Hour: A Changeless Christ in a Changing World and two prayer books (one for use by people in the military and a companion book for loved ones at home).

"Tens of thousands of listeners have been blessed to learn from and be strengthened in the faith through the powerful messages delivered by Pastor Klaus," says LHM President & CEO Kurt Buchholz. "We give thanks for his faithful service as we remember his family and friends in our prayers."

"In 2004, I was serving in the military, praying to see if God wanted me to be a pastor," says Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler, Speaker of The Lutheran Hour since 2018. "Hearing Ken Klaus on The Lutheran Hour and seeing some of the materials he had written for military members encouraged me to take the next steps to become a preacher."

Before taking the Speaker's microphone, Pastor Klaus was administrative pastor of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Dallas, Texas, and served the International Lutheran Laymen's League as its pastoral advisor from 1996 through 2000. During his more than 30 years of parish ministry, he held pastoral positions at Lutheran churches in Texas, Minnesota, Illinois, and South Dakota.

Pastor Klaus is survived by his wife, Pam, and three adult children, Kurt, Kirsten, and Kristianna. He was a beloved grandfather as well as a friend to many people around the world.

#### FLC Prayer Chain

New members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going! You can join either a Phone or an E-Mail Chain. Participation is simple, but so very powerful! The Bible says in Phil



4:6, <u>"But in everything by prayer and supplication, with</u> <u>thanksgiving, let you request be known to God.</u>" Thank you to all of our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit. How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning on down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain. Have questions, want to join, or have a prayer request? ## Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program. In addition, we are currently identifying needed equipment to purchase (50/50 match) under the AGRI Equipment grant program. On April 13, the school lunch featured Chicken Wild Rice Soup. Our FLS cook, Gina, cooked up a delicious recipe using Chicken from the Matt & Shauna Gruber Farm and Wild Rice from Northern MN. There were also ham sandwiches with ham from the Brownton Meat Market and bread from Pan-o-Gold Bakerv in St. Cloud. Everyone enjoyed a parfait with yogurt from Old Home in Bloomington, strawberries from Sharon Schauer's garden (frozen), and granola made with JD's Pure Maple Syrup from Glencoe. On April 20, we enjoyed a delicious Pork & Bean Chili. This featured the last of the pork that we had processed last summer. It also contained tomatoes and peppers from our school garden (frozen). Our sandwiches featured Peter Pan peanut butter, another MN product! On April 24, hamburgers from Alsleben Meats in Glencoe were enjoyed!

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be. Homegrown is a good thing. Plant that bells and let it ring!

We are tasking our student council to come up with ideas to help reduce lunch food waste. In addition, we'd like to better utilize the composting bin located by our school garden. We're looking forward to seeing what kind of thoughts and solutions are generated!

Looking ahead, we are planning a Homegrown Meal for the Chapel Family Picnic on May 25<sup>th</sup>. Might there be a few willing Dad's or Grandpa's that could come and grill burgers and hotdogs? It would be only a couple hour commitment of time. Please consider!

Our students are enthused to eat local, and we are using this program as a teaching tool, so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from.


