Coming Soon: God's Living Water: Covered in Jesus' Grace

On Sunday, June 18th we will begin a special seven-week congregational study at First Lutheran called "God's Living Water: Covered in Jesus' Grace" (© 2022 Concordia Publishing House. Scripture: ESV).

God's Living Water will include a seven-week sermon series and adult and high-school-age Bible class lessons.

God's Living Water examines how God uses water throughout the Bible to reveal His mercy and grace for lost sinners through His Son, Jesus Christ.

We will focus on three water accounts in the Old Testament and four in the New Testament that show us God's gifts of faith, life, and salvation in Jesus Christ, His Son.

June 18th- Lesson 1: We begin with God creating the first man and woman and placing them in the well-watered Garden of Eden. When Adam and Eve disobey God, He drives them from the provision of the garden but promises a Savior who will be with them always.

June 25th- Lesson 2: Next, we see God lead Israel from slavery in Egypt, through a parched wilderness, on the way to the Promised Land. When the people cry out to Him in thirst, He brings water out of a rock for them. That rock is Christ, who is always with us to forgive us and provide for all our needs.

July 9th- Lesson 3: In the third lesson, a Syrian official with leprosy is brought to the prophet Elisha, who commands him to go and wash in the Jordan River. That official (Naaman) is angry at first and refuses the prophet's instruction, but he later relents and finds healing in God's Word joined with water. We enjoy great benefits of peace and salvation when we receive His cleansing in the water of our Baptism.

July 16th- Lesson 4: In this lesson, Jesus stops at a well in Samaria, where He asks a Samaritan woman to give Him a drink of water. Jesus turns the conversation from His physical thirst to her much deeper spiritual thirst, promising her life-giving water, which will forever satisfy her spirit's thirst.

July 23rd- Lesson 5: In this lesson, Jesus drops to His hands and knees to wash His disciples' feet as they sit around the table for His Last Supper. He sets an example to love and serve one another and demonstrates His love for the world—the love that leads Him to the cross and empty tomb.

July 30^{th} . Lesson 6: In Lesson 6, the risen and ascended Jesus pours out His Holy Spirit upon the apostles. Peter preaches Jesus crucified, dead, and risen to the large crowd, of which three thousand believe and are baptized.

August 6th- Lesson 7: In this final lesson, the apostle Paul and his missionary partners meet a group of Jewish women gathered by a riverside for prayer. After hearing the Good News of Jesus' salvation, Lydia welcomes the missionaries to her home and brings her entire household to be baptized.

I am looking forward to being "refreshed and keeping cool" in God's Word with you this summer through "God's Living Water: Covered in Jesus' Grace"!



Nominating Committee


The Nominating Committee will soon be recruiting new board members for all of our Church Boards. These positions are to serve two-year terms beginning January 1, 2024.

FLC Prayer Chain

New members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going! You can join either a Phone or an E-Mail Chain. Participation is simple, but so



very powerful! The Bible says in Phil 4:6, "But in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let you request be known to God." Thank you to all of our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit.

How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain.



Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!



The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program. In addition, we are currently identifying needed equipment to purchase (50/50 match) under

the AGRI Equipment grant program.

On May 4, the school lunch featured an Egg Bake (eggs from Michael's Foods) with Pork Sausage (from City Meats in Brownton). Eggs are a "superfood" because they contain a little bit of everything our bodies need. Pork is an excellent source of protein, niacin and thiamine, vitamins B6 and B12, iron, and zinc. We also baked Rhubarb Coffee Cake. Since the rhubarb was barely peeking out of the ground, we are grateful to Deb Schleeter, Sue Plath, and Sharon Schauer for suppling us with frozen rhubarb from last season. Rhubarb is rich in Vitamin K1 – did you know that rhubarb is not a fruit but a vegetable? That day we also conducted a taste test with cheese curds (plain and taco flavored) from Bongard's Creamery. Ask a FLS student which they liked best!

On May 18, we enjoyed ham sandwiches (ham from City Meats in Brownton and buns from Pan-O-Gold Bakery in St. Cloud). We also cut rhubarb into chunks, sprinkled it with sugar, and had the student's taste. Some thought it was too sour, others loved it!

On May 25, we'll hold our final Homegrown Meal of this school year – it'll be a picnic! Jim & Jan Plath have volunteered to grill burgers (from Alsleben Meats in Glencoe) and wieners. Michelle and Cindy will be dishing out yogurt (from Old Home) topped with a rhubarb compote (from Cindy's garden).

As we conclude this school year, we want to thank everyone who helped in any way with our Homegrown efforts!

Our students are enthused to eat locally, and we are using this program as a teaching tool, so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors from whom we can purchase. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food waste.

We are currently searching for sources for next year's lunches. Might anyone be willing to grow some vegetables that we might purchase in late summer? We are especially looking for Delicata Squash, Green Beans, Cucumbers, Watermelon, Cantaloupe, Zucchini, Acorn Squash, Berries, Apples, and more.

We will, of course, grow some things in our School Garden this summer; but we can utilize more which can be frozen for year-round use.

Also, do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day!

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH CEMETERY

Our cemetery guidelines ensure peace and respect for all. At First Lutheran, we want to honor and respect all of the families that have chosen us as the final resting place for their loved ones. We also want to ensure that our cemetery is a place where any family member or friend can come to cherish the life of a loved one. With that in mind, please review the guidelines shown below. These guidelines, along with photos/examples of acceptable and unacceptable displays, are also available on our web site at www.firstglencoe.org/about/cemetery. Please note that cleanup date has been extended to Fall – this means that floral displays may now remain out until OCTOBER 1st.

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH CEMETERY GUIDELINES

First Lutheran Cemetery has the following rules and regulations in place for the safety and maintenance of the landscape.

FLORAL REGULATIONS

The ground planting of flowers, shrubs, or trees by the lot owner is not permitted. The Cemetery Board shall have authority to remove all floral designs, flowers, weeds, trees, shrubs, plants, or herbage of any kind from the cemetery as soon as, in the judgement of the cemetery board, they become unsightly, dangerous, detrimental, or diseased, or when they do not conform to the standards maintained. The Cemetery Board shall not be liable for floral pieces, baskets, or frames in which or to which such floral pieces are attached. The Cemetery Board shall not be liable for lost, misplaced, or broken flower vases. The Cemetery Board shall not be responsible for plants, herbage, or plantings of any kind damaged by the elements, thieves, vandals, or by other causes beyond its control.

CERTAIN ORNAMENTS PROHIBITED

The placing of boxes, shells, toys, metal designs, ornaments, chairs, glass, wood or iron cases, and related articles upon lots shall not be permitted, and if so placed, the Cemetery Board may remove the same.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Glass vases and containers will not be allowed.
- 2. Cut flowers or casket sprays may be removed from the ground within seven days after burial.
- 3. Unsightly flowers and wreaths will be removed.
- 4. Live plants or plastic decorative arrangements will be allowed only in approved pots, urns, holders, shepherd hooks, or iron plant stands.
- 5. Wreaths will be permitted if they are attached to the monument or in approved holders.
- All bronze cups will have to be turned down by October 1st to prevent damage and all cut and imitation flowers shall be removed by October 1st.
- 7. We encourage you to pull the vases/rings in the flat stone section to prevent damage during snow removal.
- 8. The Cemetery Board shall not be responsible for seasonal arrangements, plant stands, hooks, pots, or vases damaged in the winter (due to snow removal for funerals or damaged due to the necessary removal of such items).
- Items in stands need to be placed in line with the monument as close to the sides within the 2' wide cement wash. Not in front of or behind the monument.
- 10. These rules and regulations and other information may be obtained from the First Lutheran Church Office or www.firstlgencoe.org/about/cemetery.
