Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." [John 13:34-35, English Standard Version (ESV)]

"Loving the 'Unlovable"

Have you ever met someone whom you find it very difficult to like, let alone love, as Jesus commanded? Perhaps that person has said or done something mean or hurtful toward you or a loved one and you really want to get revenge. Or, maybe, he or she is simply not a very nice person to be around. Other than trying to stay as far away from him or her as possible, what should you do in regard to that person?

I once heard a celebrity being interviewed. She had had her ups and downs in her career and in her personal life. Some made fun of her. Some said terrible things about her. The interviewer asked, 'Do you hate those people who say such mean things about you?' This celebrity who happens to be a Christian said, "No. I pray for them. You can't hate anyone you are praying for."

Jesus Christ once spoke these words: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 5:43-44, ESV).

Jesus could speak with authority on the subject of loving one's enemies and praying for those who persecute you. Our sins had made us enemies of the Holy God, but instead of taking revenge on us Jesus, God's Son, came to lay down His perfect life to cover our sins, so that we would no longer be God's enemies. He even prayed for His persecutors as He was being nailed to His cross. How fortunate we are that instead of staying far away from us, as we tend to do in regard to our enemies, Jesus came to Earth, died, and then rose again for us so we can live with Him and His Father in heaven forever.

So, pray for those who persecute you. Yes, pray for those whom you don't like. Even pray for those who hate you. Having been loved by God when we were "unlovable" because of our sins, we love our enemies who sin against us. We also pray for them, because after all, you "can't hate anyone you are praying for." Then wait and see the positive changes God will make both in you and in those for whom you are praying!

FLC Prayer Chain

New members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going! You can join either a Phone or an E-Mail Chain. Participation is simple, but so



very powerful! The Bible says in Phil 4:6, "But in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let you request be known to God." Thank you to all of our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit.

How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain.

The Journey of a First Lutheran Quilt



The journey of a First Ev. Lutheran quilt starts in the compassionate heart of the quilter. She (and some "he's") cut fabric and begin sewing blocks at home. The journey continues in the west room of the church

basement where the guilt is assembled, tied, and securely boxed. It then makes its way to a storage facility in Mayer, Minnesota, but not for long. When there are enough quilts and human-care items to fill a pick-up truck and trailer, a volunteer drives the guilts to the large Orphan Grain Train warehouse in Norfolk, Nebraska. Our quilts will wait there, but not for long. When the need arises, large shipping containers will be filled and taken by semi-trucks to areas of need (disaster areas) here in the United States. Some of them will go by ocean barge to needy people in far-away lands. From the port of entry, quilts and other items are transported to distribution sites. Every step of the process is overseen by Orphan Grain Train. Some guilts are also given to Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch. Both Dakota Boys and Girls ranch and Orphan Grain Train are Recognized Service Organizations (RSO) of Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.

When our First Ev. Lutheran quilters make a quilt, they never know exactly where it will end up. But they know that after a long (or short) journey it will be a beautiful blessing made with the love of Christ and the love of Christians to the person who receives it.

First Ev. Lutheran guilters meet on Mondays and various other times during the week to assemble and tie guilts in the west room of the church basement. You can help with this process:



Take Me Out to the Ballgame!

Our community group trip to Target Field will depart First Lutheran Church at 4 pm on Tuesday, August 15th. (Motorcoach Bus begins loading at 3:45). After a pickup stop in Plato at the C-Store, we'll be on our way to see the MN Twins play the Detroit Tigers. At Target Field, the bus will drop off and pick up along 7th Street (Gate 14) – we will ALL need to assemble at our spot at game close for the return trip home. Our seats are located in Section 213 (Home Plate Terrace).

Attendees are permitted to bring the following into Target Field – Single-compartment, soft-sided containers, and bags 16"x16"x8" or smaller. All bags will be searched prior to entering. (Guests will be scanned upon entry.) Sealed, bottled water 32 oz. or less, and soft-sided, single juice or milk containers for children are the only outside beverages permitted. The Twins also allow you to bring an empty water bottle as there are Pentair water filling stations within Target Field. Food items are permitted, as long as they are not brought in hard-sided containers and are consumed in the general seating areas.

The Twins welcome support as demonstrated by homemade signs and banners.

Please also plan to bring a credit or debit card for Target Field purchases. Cash is no longer accepted at the stadium.

Homegrown! It's a Good Thing.

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program. As this newsletter goes to press, we are still awaiting delivery of equipment (freezer/cooler) that we were able to purchase (50/50 match) under the AGRI Equipment grant program.

In mid-July, we chopped and froze some zucchini for upcoming school lunches. Does anyone have any extra rhubarb that we might freeze? We have already talked with Shimanski Orchard concerning pears and apples and Cindy & Scott Litzau concerning local honey. In addition, we've ordered some MN grown oatmeal and black beans. We continue to search for additional sources. Might anyone be willing to grow some fruits and vegetables that we might purchase? We are especially looking for Delicata Squash, Green Beans, Cucumbers, Watermelon, Cantaloupe, Acorn Squash, Berries, and more. We will, of course, grow some things in our School Garden this summer; but we can utilize more which can be frozen for yearround use. Also, an individual has stepped forward to help clean and freeze produce that we purchase – thank you! **Anyone else?** Many hands will make the task easier and fun!

Is anyone aware of available freezer space if we should purchase a beef or pig?

Also, do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day!

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty:

Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food

A church in Atlanta was honoring one of its senior pastors who had been retired many years. He was 92 at that time and I wondered why the church even bothered to ask the old gentleman to preach at that age. After a warm welcome, the introduction of this speaker, and as the applause quieted down, he rose from his high back chair and walked slowly, with great effort and a sliding gait to the podium. Without a note or written paper of any kind he placed both hands on the pulpit to steady himself and then quietly and slowly he began to speak....

"When I was asked to come here today and talk to you, your pastor asked me to tell you what was the greatest lesson ever learned in my 50-odd years of preaching. I thought about it for a few days and boiled it down to just one thing that made the most difference in my life and sustained me through all my trials. The one thing that I could always rely on when tears and heartbreak and pain and fear and sorrow paralyzed me...

The only thing that would comfort was this verse....

"Jesus loves me this I know.
For the Bible tells me so.
Little ones to Him belong,
We are weak but He is strong.....
Yes, Jesus loves me....
The Bible tells me so."

The old pastor stated, "I always noticed that it was the adults who chose the children's hymn 'Jesus Loves Me' (for the children of course) during a hymn sing, and it was the adults who sang the loudest because I could see they knew it the best."

"Here for you now is a Senior version of Jesus Loves Me":

JESUS LOVES ME
Jesus loves me, this I know,
Though my hair is white as snow
Though my sight is growing dim,
Still He bids me trust in Him.

(CHORUS – repeat after each verse)
YES, JESUS LOVES ME.. YES, JESUS LOVES ME..
YES, JESUS LOVES ME, FOR THE BIBLE TELLS ME SO.

Though my steps are oh, so slow, With my hand in His I'll go On through life, let come what may, He'll be there to lead the way.

Though I am no longer young, I have much which He's begun. Let me serve Christ with a smile, Go with others the extra mile.


