Take a break from the holiday rush and hear what the hymns and Scriptures have to say this Advent season, not only as they prepare to celebrate with joy the first coming of our Lord Jesus, as the precious baby of Bethlehem, but also as they prepare us to be ready for Jesus' promised second coming on the Last Day, as our triumphant Savior. That is when He will bring all who trust in Him to eternal joy in heaven. Happy Advent!

The McLeod Emergency Food Shelf (MEFS) is a non-profit agency which was organized in 1983 to assist residents of McLeod County. MN in hunger relief.

MEFS receives financial donations and food support donations from the individuals, organizations, civic groups, businesses, food rescue partners, and faith partners of McLeod County.

Since 1983, millions of meals have been provided by the generous support of the local community. In the first year, 109 were served with the number stretching over the years to as many as 1.857 district households. More than a half million pounds of food are distributed each year!

Blessing Bags Donated



FLC Prayer Chain

Is the Holy Spirit touching your heart regarding the Prayer Chain? New leaders AND new members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going!



Participation is simple, but so very powerful! The Bible says in Phil 4:6, <u>"But in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let you request be known to God.</u>" Thank you to all our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit.

How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave a message relaying the information. Continue phoning on down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain. (NEW MEMBERS ARE NEEDED IF THE PHONE CHAIN IS TO CONTINUE)

Christmas Gift Boxes

For Children

First Ev. Lutheran Women in Mission LWML, partnering with Orphan Grain Train, is assembling and shipping Christmas gift boxes for underprivileged children. Many children living in poverty areas around the world may never receive a Christmas present. When parents and grandparents are struggling to provide daily food, gifts at Christmas (or any time) are not a high priority.

Would you like to help with this project? Families, individuals, and groups are welcomed to participate. You will bring smiles to the faces of children all around the world. The approximate cost of one box is about \$32. You may:

- Assemble a box yourself
- Use this as a family project
- Work together with a friend
- Work together with a grandchild
- When Grandma says, "Oh, I don't need another Christmas present," give her a completed Christmas Box. And then deliver it back to church for her.
- Complete your box and deliver it back to the church by January 7.
- If you want to participate, but don't have the time to shop, you may drop off a check at the church office. Make it payable to First Ev. LWML with "Christmas Box" in the memo line. Any amount.
- Most important PRAY for the recipient of your box.

Pick up a box (specially designed for this project) and instruction sheet from the display near the Fellowship Center. It's important that you follow the instructions carefully. Do not decorate the box in any way. Include ONLY the items listed on the instruction sheet. The instruction sheet is very clear on what to include. Boxes are categorized for "Boy" or "Girl" with items appropriate for either age 2-7 or 8-12. Each box WILL INCLUDE a beautiful Christmas card with a printed Christmas message provided by Orphan Grain Train.

Do not be tempted to add "extras." **No additions, deletions, or substitutions. Do not add money, photos, or personal notes**. Orphan Grain Train has relationships and permission with the countries/areas where the boxes are delivered. Officials at the dropoff points will spot-check the boxes. If they find a discrepancy in even one box, the entire shipment may be discarded. After being quality checked, our boxes will be delivered to an Orphan Grain Train storage facility in Mayer. Then a volunteer will deliver them by pick-up truck and trailer to the large Orphan Grain Train warehouse in Norfolk, Nebraska. Volunteers there will send them by semi-truck or ocean barge to their next destination. The Christmas Box project is a year-long project.

"Orphan Grain Train" is an RSO "Recognized Service Organization" of Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. It ships donated food, clothing, medical and other needed item to people in over 71 different countries including the USA. They have a 4 Star 100% rating from Charity Navigator. Nearly all of their workers are volunteer. No bigname celebrities earning high, executive salaries. Motto: Relief for Human Need Worldwide. You can read more about them at www.ogt.org.

Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies we received are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods



(beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our FLS lunch program. We have recently submitted an application for additional future funds.

The October 12th Homegrown lunch featured Hamburger Cabbage Cheese Casserole, Sweet Corn, Zucchini Bread, Apples, and fresh pressed Apple Cider. The beef was purchased at Brownton City Meats, the Busse family supplied the super-sized head of cabbage, the Sweet Corn from Seneca Foods in Glencoe, Zucchini from the Diers family, Apples from Shimanski Orchard of Silver Lake, and the fresh pressed Apple Cider from Faxon Farms of Blakeley. Together we celebrated Minnesota Apples with the BIG CRUNCH – we all counted down and then bit into our delicious apples! Once they bit into their apples, the students were asked to think about....What flavors did you taste? Tangy, sweet, sour, tart?......What was the texture? Crisp, crunchy, juicy, soft?.......Did you hear a noise?

On October 26th, the Homegrown lunch included Delicata Squash and fresh Apple Crisp. The Delicata Squash came from Dave & Tammy Anderson of Hamburg and the Apples from Sam McNellis of Glencoe. Delicata Squash has a creamy flesh and a thin edible skin – it's high in potassium and Vitamins A & C. They are sweet and delicious and the skin tastes great – plus they are super easy to prepare! We hope everyone tries this MN squash!

On November 2nd, the Homegrown lunch included Egg Salad Sandwiches (eggs donated from Michael Foods), Carrot Sticks (Tangletown Gardens), and Pumpkin Cake. Did you know that carrots (a root vegetable) come in both orange and yellow colors? The students were surveyed to see if they thought the yellow tasted differently than the orange – no clear decision was reached about that! The cake utilized pumpkins raised in Mrs. Donnay's sister's garden. We cooked and mashed the pie pumpkins and baked them into a delicious cake!

On November 16th, we featured a hotdish with MN Beef (Brownton Meat Market) and Tomatoes, Onions, Peppers that were preserved from the garden. We served Sweet Corn (Seneca) that we earlier froze and carrot sticks from a FLS family. Students also enjoyed homemade zucchini bread. Did you know that zucchini is a member of the squash family; like carrots, zucchini also has a lot of Vit A.

On November 20th, we surprised the students with bison burgers. The bison meat, purchased from Horseshoe Grove Bison in Paynesville, is a delicious meat which cooks fast, due to its leanness. Bison is always free of antibiotics and hormones. It's naturally rich and sweet, high in Zinc, Selenium, phosphorus, and Vitamin B12. Horseshoe Grove Bison is owned by Mrs. Michelle Alsleben's uncle; she has a fascinating video of a recent bison roundup. If you'd like to view this, just contact Michelle and she'll forward to you! Along with the bison burgers, we served roasted potatoes and a yummy sweet potato casserole – all from the School Garden.

Do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day! We need your ideas!

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food waste.



The CHRISMONS that decorate our CHRISTMAS TREE

Chrismon, is a combination of two words: CHRISt and MONogram. A Chrismon is an omament (always in white and gold to symbolize the purity and majesty of the Son of God), which depicts some divine attribute of Christ or reminds one of a divine gift that Christ bestows. The Chrismon Tree is a visual sermon in which the believer sees the blessed message of the Christmas Gospel - that Christ came as man's Savior. It is our hope that this brief description of some of the various symbols used on the ornaments will make our ChrismonTree more meaningful.

The earliest symbols for our Savior are letters from the Greek alphbet. Examples are:

- -The first letter (chi) of the word Christ.
- IHC or IHS -The first three letters of JESus.
- An Alpha and Omega, first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. Rev. 22:13 calls Jesus the alpha and omega, the eternal God.
- INRI an abreviation for the Latin inscription on the Cross, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews". lesus, Nazarenus, Rex ludaeorum.

A cross is a reminder of our Lord's sacrifice to redeem us from our sins. The different forms of the cross point to the various aspects of our Saviors's work. Some examples are:

- -TAU Cross, salvation promised, but not yet accomplished.
- -Cross CROSSLET, the spread of Chris-
- tanity to the North, East, South and West, to the ends of the earth. -LATIN or PASSION Cross, cross of suf-
- fering; with pointed ends it reminds us of the nails, thorns and spear. -Cross in GLORY, the rising sun behind the cross symbolizes the new day, when
- our Lord conquered death by His resurrection. -Cross TREFLEE, three circles on each
- of the ends symbolize the Holy Trinity. GREEK or LORD'S PRAYER Cross.
- All four arms of equal length.

Other symbols for our Lord and God include: CIRCLE - eternity, God who is eternal. TRIANGLE, or THREE INTERWOVEN CIRCLES

- Our Triune God; the Holy Trinity.
- STAR symbolizes the close relationship between the birth and death of our Lord; also the prophesy of His coming.
- FISH, IXOYC the Greek word for fish is an acrostic on the first letters of "Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior". The fish was a secret sign used between early Christians during times of persecution.
- BUTTERFLY Symbol of the Lord's Resurrection. - Nativity of our Lord. He was called ROSE "the Rose of Sharon".



HAND OF GOD - This is perhaps the most outstanding symbol of God the Father. God's hand is extended to give us His blessing and to supply our needs.




LAMB OF GOD - The white pennant represents the body of Christ which is attached to the cruciform staff, representing the cross on which the Lamb of God died and thru which the Risen Christ saves the world. When the Lamb is depicted lying down, reference is made to the suffering Christ. When the Lamb is standing, suggestion is given that the Lamb of God is risen triumphantly.



THE CROWN - The Kingship of our Lord Jesus Christ as He sits at the right hand of the Father and rules over the world and His church on earth. It also can represent the reward of the faithful Christian life.

THE DESCENDING DOVE - The most usual symbol of the Holy Spirit, reminding us of how the Holy Spirit appeared upon Jesus at the time of His baptism by John the Baptist.

THE SHELL on the 8-POINTED STAR -The shell is a symbol for Holy Baptism, as



THE CHALICE & WAFER on 8-POINTED STAR - A symbol of the Lord's Supper. The 6-pointed star is called the Creator's Star, reminding us that thru the Body and Blood of Jesus we are brought back into harmony with God.

THE WHEAT and GRAPES - Another symbol of the Lord's Supper.



THE FIERY CHARIOT - As Elijah ascended into Heaven on the Fiery Charlot, so, this Chrismon reminds us of the Ascension of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
