## Restore the Roar!

Sometime around the year 762 BC, Amos, a herdsman from the small Judean town of Tekoa, heard the voice of God and compared it to hearing the roaring of a lion, a roaring that causes pastures to mourn and forests to wither (Amos 1:2). That is some kind of roar! The prophet then personally encounters the LORD as a Lion (3:12), and this propels him to confront Israel's movers and shakers who were deaf to God's call of justice and righteousness (see 5:24 and 7:1-17).

What set off this divine roaring that sent Amos into the fray? People were busy with religion, but they were not heartbroken over what was happening to the little people on the fringes of society (see 6:1-7). Samaria, Israel's capital, was a place of affluence and power that was indifferent to the poor. So, the LORD roared, and Amos preached.

There are biblical images of God as a caring Shepherd (like Psalm 23) and a mighty redeemer (see Job 19:25). But we dare not let these images remove the claws and teeth of the Lion who roars from Zion. Throughout the Book of Amos, the Lion Sends fires and earthquakes, locusts and droughts, famines, diseases, and an army bent on the complete annihilation of Israel. His wrath and anger are real. Amos declares that Israel's most sacred institutions-its temple and systems of worship, priesthood, covenant, land entitlement, election tradition, and kingship- will not avert disaster. Long-standing institutions associated with God's blessings, cherished belief systems, and a social structure that appeared invincible will come to a cataclysmic end (Amos 8:1-3). The prophet insists that the kings, priests, and leaders are engaging in an enormous deception, a huge lie.

The message of his book is singular- Restore the Roar!
This Lent, we will listen to the Lion as He rumbles in His jungle, pointing out our complacency, duplicity, and sin. But - and thank God for this - the ferocious Lion is also the bleeding Lamb. Our Lord's mighty power is made most perfect in the weakness of the cross (2 Corinthians 12:9). And gathering under the cross, we will all the more be amazed when the roaring Lion defeats His greatest enemies, the devil, hell, and the power of death. Then with resurrection joy we will say of Jesus, "The Lion of the tribe of Judah, He has triumphed" (Revelation 5:5).

On Easter, the roar of God's saving love is restored forevermore!

## FROM THE DCE DESK...

Growing Pains are GOOD!

"Eat your dinner so you can grow up to be as big as daddy/mommy." We've all said it-or heard someone else say it. No matter how much we ask our children to slow down and stop growing up so fast, we also want them to grow: physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Paul tells the church at Corinth that growth changes things, as it should! "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways" (1 Corinthians 13:11). Simon Peter, the apostle, also wrote in his epistle, "For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge...grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ..." (2 Peter 1:5, 3:18a). Growing, learning, maturing these are profitable and noble pursuits. But sometimes growth hurts.

Bones stretch and harden-it's painful, but necessary. Learning a lesson at the expense of one's pride-it's painful, but necessary. Creating a habit of living a Christian lifestyle, avoiding places where sin tempts us, but also ensuring we are present where we receive the Word and Sacrament (worship) and are fed in our faith (youth groups, Sunday School, etc...)-it can be painful, but so, SO necessary.

The habits we instill in our children are an investment in their futures, short-term, long-term, and into eternity. Much like training a child in not only properly loading the dishwasher-but also training them to see and act when the dishes need loadingtraining up our children to see and act in a manner which allows for a rich, God-pleasing Christian life can be...dare I say it—painful. But oh so necessary.

Parents alone are given the vocation and duty to train up their children in a life of Christian growth. That starts by humbly and gratefully bringing them to the baptismal font. It continues by getting them in the pew. Next is ensuring they attend Sunday School. Then comes requiring they attend youth group/confirmation/Bible study and the like. And so, it continues. Sometimes being the parent-getting them to the places where faith is fostered in addition to the sports, parties, secular groups and such—it's painful. But praise be to God that He has entrusted you with this task. He knows you can do it because He provides the strength and perseverance it may take to get them to the pew, classroom, group, or study. He, the Almighty Father, is on your side as a parent. Only with Him it is possible to "train up a child in the way [they] should go; even when [they] are old [they] will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6).

So, stick with it, parents. You are fulfilling the duty God has set before you. You are creating habits in your children which sow eternal rewards. And we as a church are here to support you in this endeavor. We are here to cheer, to be an ear or a shoulder when it's hard, to offer events/groups/fellowship where you can bring your kids for that faith formation. We lift you up in prayerthat divine gift of communicating with our own Father-so stick with it! When you make faith a priority for your kids, you're helping them grow in the right direction-toward the cross. Those are the best kinds of growing pains!

## Mat Makers

Mat Makers is a growing service project at First Ev. Lutheran. Women and men get together to make sleeping mats from plastic grocery bags. The mats will be distributed through Orphan Grain Train, an LCMS relief agency, to those who through disasters or homelessness find themselves in need of a place to sleep. They are well received. If used outdoors, the mats keep the sleeper up off the cold, damp ground. They are plastic and don't soak up moisture. They are easy to roll up and transport. Each mat keeps about 700 plastic bags out of the landfill.

Mat Makers at First Ev. Lutheran meet the second and fourth Tuesday of the month at 1:30 p.m. for devotions, matmaking, laughter, Christian fellowship and refreshments. There are MANY STEPS INVOLVED in making a mat. Some mat-makers smooth, fold and cut the bags. Others loop the bags into long plastic cording. Others wind the cord into tight balls. (Some of the men really do a good job of winding). Finally, other crafters crochet the plastic cording into mats. Some mat-makers enjoy the craft so much they take bags home with them and continue making mats at home.

Is this a way you would like to serve your Savior? Stop in and see what it's all about. The craft is easy to learn.

## Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies we received are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program.
The January 11th Homegrown lunch featured a Zucchini Hamburger Casserole, Green Beans, and Zucchini Cake with frosting. We used Zucchini that was chopped (casserole), shredded (cake), and frozen last fall. Zucchini contains lots of fiber for healthy digestion and also promotes strong bones. The green beans, rich in Vitamin C, were harvested last summer from the school garden, chopped, and frozen. The ground beef, purchased at City Meats in Brownton, comes from Angus cattle sourced from local MN family farms.
On January $25^{\text {th }}$, the students enjoyed Chicken Wild Rice Soup cooked with chicken from the Gruber family farm and wild rice from northern MN, In addition, they had cheese curds from the Bongards Creamery... Has everyone stopped by the cow statue in Bongards to see Bonnie the Big Cow? They also enjoyed homemade granola made with JD's Maple Syrup from Glencoe. This was a perfect meal for a winter's day!
Do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day! We need your ideas!
After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty:
Homegrown's all right with me
Homegrown is the way it should be
Homegrown is a good thing
Plant that bell and let it ring!
Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food waste.
