
The Altar Guild will meet on Tuesday, January 2, 2024 at 5:00 pm to take down Christmas decorations, followed by a meeting







MAT MAKERS A New First Lutheran Service Group 2nd and 4th Tuesdays, 1:30 p.m.

"Mat Makers" is a new service group here at First Evangelical Lutheran. Men and women meet to craft and crochet plastic grocery-type bags into sleeping mats. You DO NOT need to know how to crochet to be a part of this group. There are MANY steps involved before crocheting begins:

- Smooth and flatten the bag
- Fold the bag
- Cut the folded bag into about 2" loops
- Loop the loops together to form a long chain
- Wind the long chain into a ball (Some of the men really enjoy this step. They wind the balls very tightly and neatly.)

Crocheters then use a large hook to crochet the balls into sleeping mats. EACH STEP is very important.

Mat Makers meet the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 1:30 p.m. for a short devotion, crafting, laughing, and visiting. Then we clean up and enjoy a little snack before going home. Some of the Mat Makers choose to the crafting at home.

Women and men of First Lutheran, if this is a service project that appeals to you, PLEASE COME and see what it's all about. Bring a scissor. Bring a friend if you want. It's a fun afternoon of serving the Lord by making sleeping mats for His dear children.

FLC Prayer Chain

Is the Holy Spirit touching your heart regarding the Prayer Chain? New leaders AND new members are needed to keep our PRAYER CHAIN going!



Participation is simple, but so very powerful! The Bible says in Phil 4:6, <u>"But in everything by prayer and supplication, with</u> <u>thanksgiving, let you request be known to God.</u>" Thank you to all our current members for their commitment to prayer – to confidentiality, discretion, and listening to the Holy Spirit. How does it work?

E-Mail Chain – Simply receive the email from the prayer chain leader and pray immediately.

Phone Chain – Simply receive a phone call from another prayer chain member with a request. When you receive the call, write down the prayer request word for word as dictated to you. Pray immediately and then call the next person on your chain passing on the dictated info. If you are unable to reach that person, leave

a message relaying the information. Continue phoning on down the list until you reach a person or the end of the chain. (NEW MEMBERS ARE NEEDED IF THE PHONE CHAIN IS TO CONTINUE)

Did you know the verse "it's easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than a rich man to enter heaven," does not mean a sewing needle? In ancient times those gates had two large leaves and a smaller door called the eye of the needle intended only for the passage of pedestrians. When the large gates were closed, getting a camel through the eye of the needle required the camel to shed its load and bend its legs and neck. It was a difficult task that often left scratches. Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies we received are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program. We are currently working on application of some future funds. The December 7th Homegrown lunch featured and Egg Bake with pork sausage and cheese and pumpkin cake. The eggs were from Doug Schultz and the pork sausage from Brownton Meats. The students were asked to guess how many total eggs were cracked and used – the answer was 102! After browning the pork sausage, it was mixed with the scrambled eggs and other ingredients and then baked in the oven about 1 hour. The cake was made from the pumpkins we froze this fall (pumpkins came from Mrs. Donnay's sister's garden). We defrosted the frozen pumpkin and then mixed it with chocolate chips and other yummy ingredients before baking at 350 degrees for about an hour.

On December 14th, we tried something that the Student Council had requested – Chicken Alfredo. We purchased 6 chickens from the Gruber Family and baked them. These free-range chickens grew up and were butchered on the farm, then were frozen till we were ready to cook them. We used sliced chicken breasts for our delicious Chicken Alfredo meal – we'll have the rest of the chicken in a future meal. Chicken provides vitamins and minerals involved with brain function, helps build muscle, strengthens bones, and promotes heart health!

Our final meal for 2023 featured Chilidogs. The wieners were purchased from the Brownton Meat Market and were topped with beef chili and cheese. This lunch also featured home-made fries from the Sweet Potatoes grown this summer in the school garden. Finally, the students enjoyed a yummy yogurt parfait topped with sliced strawberries that were picked by Victory Produce in Cokato. We froze these berries back in June! Strawberries are very healthy, containing many antioxidants and vitamins – it was quite a treat to have this for a December meal!

Do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day! We need your ideas!

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty:

Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food waste.
