Wounds Now Healed-Jesus and Yours

Wounds. We all have them. Some of us are battling terrible physical trials. Even if the wounds you carry around are *not* physical ones, they drain the life out of you just the same. Rejection can be a terrible wound. You try hard to be accepted by people at school or by someone you like or by the person you married or by your own parents or by your children. When you want to be accepted and appreciated, rejection can cut deep. Sometimes we feel pressure to do things we know we shouldn't do. Peer pressure at school, the pressure of job security or making commission—pressure leaves its mark. Even worse, at times we wound ourselves. We cut ourselves away from God when we let the little temptations lead us down dangerous paths. There are many things that cut us down in this world.

Whatever your wounds are, look to Easter. On the first Easter morning, out of a tomb walks One who suffered the deadliest of wounds. With several fatal wounds, Jesus should have stayed dead, but He came out of the tomb. He came out of the tomb to be back in the world where we need Him most.

Jesus rose from the grave which means our sin is atoned for, the devil is defeated, and death is overcome in victory! The wounds He endured on Good Friday are healed forever.

Easter isn't just a then-and-there event. Easter happened almost two thousand years ago, and it comes to you today. Jesus' resurrection is here for you now. Jesus overcame all His wounds so that He may bring healing to *yours*.

Through His powerful Word and Sacraments, Jesus comes to be with you so that you know that no matter what wounds you suffer, no matter what disasters come your way, no matter what pain and suffering you bring on others or on yourself, you have One Who is with you Who overcomes all wounds.

Through His Word and Sacraments, Jesus will always come to us until the Last Day, when He will empty every grave. *In Christ.*

FROM THE DCE DESK...

John recorded in his gospel once when Jesus had asked the twelve if they wanted to leave (like some of the other followers were doing) and Peter responded by saying "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (6:68b). I can't wait to meet Peter in heaven. From what I know of him by reading about him in the Bible, he was either spot-on or batting a thousand, and not frequently anywhere in the middle. This time—spot-on and that made me wonder...when we, as parents, face hard times concerning the rearing of our children, where do we turn? I propose we take a hint from Peter and boldly state, "Lord, You have the words of eternal life, we will reorient ourselves (and therefore our families), toward You through the Word and Sacraments You have so graciously given us this side of heaven!"

Wouldn't that be great?! It's true too, the Word that God has revealed to us is a 66-book library of the best resources. We have examples of people who have done it right—we can imitate them. We also have prime examples of what not to do! When we take our God-given vocations as parents seriously, we are in the Word. After all, He has provided it for us to learn from and it is literally the words of eternal life!

When we hit bumps in the parenting road concerning specific problems facing current teens or kiddos we often assume there isn't anything in the Bible to help guide us. After all, what did David know about TikTok or Insta? Paul didn't mention Snapchat in any of the epistles I've read. The fact is though, when we are in the Word consistently. God is reforming and shaping us into being the types of people He wants us to be. This process of being made more and more holy over time is called sanctification—it's a painful growing process through which the Holy Spirit molds us to be more Christ-like, more fruitful (yes, you know, "be fruitful and multiply"). Because of all this, the Bible is the best book on parenting there ever was or ever will be. The living Word of God prepares us and equips us to desire the gifts offered in the Divine Service. The Holy Scriptures prompt us to seek out the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation offered at the communion rail in the body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. With those powerful gifts, we are the most well-prepared parents the world will ever see; thanks be to God!

Now, I'm not saying the Bible is the *only* parenting resource there is out there—I'm just saying it's the best. I'm including a couple

of links to a few other good ones I've found along the way too. Axis is an organization that provides a weekly email called *The Culture Translator*. It is phenomenal to pare down the plethora of information about what current society is bombarding our kiddos with (and it even literally translates their ever-growing vocabulary of made-up words!). From recently



released music to movies to pop culture news that our children are hearing about, I consider this source my "weekly presidential parental debriefing" prepping me for conversations to have with my kids. Totally free, this one is definitely worth signing up for!



This next resource is a page within the LCMS website. The Life Library is a stash of varied literature covering topics that will help parents face conflicts within child-rearing with confidence and knowledge. One of the articles, "All those Glowing Rectangles," has already been printed for you and is available to grab off the ALL-

AGES side of the Youth Cube near the couches! Do you have littles at home? Consider taking a moment to soak in the article, "Holy Mashed Banana Gunk!" for an uplifting read.

MEFS receives financial donations and food support donations from the individuals, organizations, civic groups, businesses, food rescue partners, and faith partners of McLeod County.

Since 1983, millions of meals have been provided by the generous support of the local community. In the first year, 109 households were served with the number stretching over the years to as many as 1,857 distinct households. More than a half million pounds of food are distributed each year!

Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies we received are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program.

The February 8th Homegrown lunch featured a cheesy-beef tater tot casserole, a marble cheese stick, pickles, and pumpkin cake. The MN ground beef came from Brownton City Meats, cheese sticks and shredded cheese from Bongards Creameries, pickles from Gedney Pickles in Chaska, eggs from Schultz Farm, and pumpkin frozen last fall from Mrs. Donnay's sister. Did you know that 20 billion pickles are eaten each year in the USA? That averages 6 jars per person! Do you know what they call a bad loser?......a sour pickle!!!

The February 22nd Homegrown lunch featured a chicken & rice casserole with chicken from Gruber Farms. Five chickens were roasted and then shredded for our casserole. We again featured Gedney pickles (students loved them last time). Our dessert was a Cinnamon Apple Cake made with eggs from Doug Schultz Farm and with apples that Mr. Scheele peeled, diced, and froze last fall. Both Gruber Farms and Schultz farm chickens are free-range and delightful to see roaming around the farms!

Do you have a favorite MN grown food menu item? Share your recipe with us and we'll invite you to lunch that day! We need your ideas!

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We are also tasking our students to work on composting and less food waste. - Some smooth the bags
- Others fold the bag into fourths
- Still others cut the bags

- Another group loops the plastic into cording
- Some wind the cording into "plarn." (Plastic + yarn = plarn)
- Finally, crocheters stitch the "plarn" into mats.

The finished mats will be shipped by Orphan Grain Train, a Christian human relief agency, to people who through disaster, misfortune, homeless or any reason are without a place to sleep. It takes approximately 700 bags to make one mat.


17th Annual Silent Auction
