What Is Pentecost?

On May 19th We Remember, and Rejoice in, that Amazing Day! May is a busy month, an **extremely** busy month! There's Mother's Day (Sunday, May 12th - don't forget to buy flowers!). There's Ascension Day (Thursday, May 9th - don't forget we have a 7PM Divine Service!). Then there's the end of the school year, the end of the Sunday School year, graduations, Memorial Day Weekend, Trinity Sunday, and more. I would like to focus on one important day in the midst of this hectic time, and that would be Pentecost. Pentecost Sunday this year falls on May 19th.

Pentecost draws us back to an important event that happened very early in the history of the Christian church and has a huge effect on us today. It had been ten days since the disciples saw Jesus ascend into heaven. It had been fifty since He fulfilled His promise to rise from the dead. Now, it was the Day of Pentecost and all the believers were together in one place and those disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit in a most miraculous way: Through a loud rushing wind, and tongues of fire above their heads (See Acts 2: 1-4). To an outsider, that may not sound very peaceful, and yet it was. Here was Jesus' gift of peace for them: the promised Holy Spirit. They were not left abandoned and alone. They had Christ's peace through the powerful working of the Holy Spirit.

The same comfort is yours today as the same Holy Spirit continues to work in Word and Sacraments; Baptism, the Lord's Supper and though God's spirit-filled Word. Here God, the Holy Spirit, delivers to you the forgiveness of sins and the sure and certain hope of everlasting life in the perfect peace of heaven. Peace is offered to you, even now, in the midst of life that sometimes feel anything but calm and peaceful.

Do you know what peace is? It's not the absence of sin. It's the forgiveness of sin. God loves you and forgives you every day for all of your sins, because Jesus died for you. You never have to feel like God hates you or is punishing you. Jesus died for all of that. There is peace between you and God. Like the disciples on Pentecost, you also are never abandoned by the Lord.

Peace is not the absence of death in this world. Peace is having the sure hope of eternal life. Peace is believing that "whoever lives and believes in (Jesus) will never die" because He is "the Resurrection and the Life" (John 11:25-26).

Peace is not the absence of trouble in this world. It's the presence of Christ which comes to us through God's Holy Spirit. It is believing that Jesus is with you always. He is your strength when you feel weak, your shelter, your wisdom.

What awesome, comforting news! For anyone and everyone in search of peace, the search is over in Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Christ's peace be with you as we celebrate the day of Pentecost this year and always!




and go visit a sister congregation during your travels. Being present to hear the Word and to receive the gifts God generously pours out on us is a summer bucket-list worthy item!


members age 18 and older are encouraged to attend. Among other business, the 2024-2025 Budget will be reviewed.



The April 11th Homegrown lunch featured Chicken Enchiladas made with roasted <u>Chicken</u> from the *Gruber Farm* and homemade flour tortillas made by Olga Pineda of Glencoe. Our dessert was a cookie made with <u>Popcorn</u> from *Tangletown Gardens* in Plato. Have you ever had a cookie with popcorn as a main ingredient? The students said they were delicious! Let us know if you'd like the recipe!

The April 18th Homegrown lunch featured Brats made with local Beef from the Brownton Meat Market, Sauerkraut from Cabbage preserved by the Starland Hutterite Community from Gibbon, Roasted Yellow Carrots from Tangletown Gardens, a casserole made with Sweet Potatoes from the FLS Garden, and Zucchini Cake made with Zucchini from Glencoe Area Gardens.

After each Homegrown meal, the students sing a little ditty: Homegrown's all right with me Homegrown is the way it should be Homegrown is a good thing Plant that bell and let it ring!

Our students are enthused to eat local and we are using this program as a teaching tool so they learn about what they are eating, how it was raised, and how it was prepared. We continue to source local vendors whom we can purchase from. We have also tasked our students to work on composting and less food waste.

First Lutheran School Students

Education Fund Scholarships are again open for the 2024-2025 academic year. All First Lutheran Church member families with students enrolled in First Lutheran School are eligible for scholarships. Scholarship awards are based on financial need AND on the amount of available funds from the Edwin & Ella Ponath Education Fund (\$4590.98), Melvin & Marlys Tessmer Tuition Aid Fund (\$502.25), and FLS Scholarship Fund (\$56.61). Applications are mailed to all member families with students in Kindergarten through Grade 7. (Prospective member students should also apply.) The application forms are also available from our website or upon request. Completed applications must be returned by June 17, 2024 in order to be considered for the 2024-2025 academic year.

First Lutheran School <u>Tuition Aid</u> may also be available to all students in Grades Kindergarten – 8th Grade. The amount of aid is calculated with a formula based on Adjusted Gross Income (AGI). Please complete the application form on our website www.firstglencoe.org and turn in the page of your tax form 1040 that includes your AGI to the Church/School Office before July 31, 2024.


