#### The Resurrection of Our Lord

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! When the women came to His tomb, carrying spices in their hands, they expected to find a dead body. However, they found a stone rolled away and angels proclaiming that Christ lives. Oh, how their sorrow turned to joy! It was necessary for Jesus to be delivered into the hands of the sinful men. He is not to be found in the place of death, and soon He will meet His disciples, all as He said. David knew this joy nearly a thousand years before Christ's resurrection. Jesus is the one who did not see corruption in the tomb and fulfills these words: "You make known to me the path of life; in Your presence there is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore" (Psalm 16:11). Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

#### Midweek Lenten Service Themes



## ° Midweek of Lent (April 2nd)

When Jesus reached out and touched the bier of the widow's dead son, the funeral procession was stopped dead in its tracks. Like the prophets Elijah and Elisha before Him, Jesus raised the only child of a woman in need. When Jesus touches death, it can only mean life. Above all, in

Christ's cross, He destroyed death by His death (2 Tim. 1:10). Christ touched death, and death was overcome by His resurrection life. When our sin and its deadly consequences are touched by Jesus in Baptism, we are united to His death and resurrection. So we are now "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (Romans 6:11).

## ° Midweek of Lent 5 (April 9th)

All things are in the hands of Jesus. There is no authority that is above Him, and He will continue to exercise that authority for us until the end of the age. Salvation itself is in the hands of Jesus. As we have seen throughout this series, Jesus continues to use those hands for our good and, above all, for our salvation. He has given that authority to the church for the sake of making disciples by baptizing and teaching. As we prepare to enter into Holy Week, we see the specific ways that those hands, into which the Father has given all things, have worked forgiveness, life, and salvation.

## ° Holy (Maundy) Thursday (April 17<sup>th)</sup>

Christ, seeing that all things were in His hands, chose to use them to serve His disciples (John 13:3). Taking the form of a servant, He took their dirty feet into His hands and washed them. Above all, He served His disciples by feeding them. He took bread and wine into His pure and holy hands, blessed them, and then gave us so much more: His very body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of faith.

# ° Good Friday (April 18<sup>th)</sup>

The Lord's hands, feet, and side were pierced for our transgressions. The hands that the Lord used to show compassion, lift up those who were afflicted, and bless the poor in spirit were pierced by nails driven into a cross, all for us. It is here on the cross where our Lord's outstretched hands show the heart of His compassion for us. On the cross, our Lord's outstretched hands show the heart of His compassion for us. By the mere sight alone, one would have to wonder how Jesus could do anything with His hands nailed to the cross. However, these are not just any hands. They are the hands of the Son of God, who has atoned for the sins of the world.

What incredible joy we have in the resurrection of Jesus! This is not just a *seasonal* joy we celebrate at Easter—it is the foundation of our entire lives. Because Christ has conquered sin, death, and the grave, we live each day as people filled with hope, peace, and unshakable J O Y!

This resurrection joy changes everything. It shapes how we worship, how we serve, and how we engage in our church community. In worship, we gather to rejoice in what God has done, lifting our voices in a response of praise, receiving His free and precious gifts of Word and Sacrament, and encouraging one another in the long journey of faith. Worship isn't just something we do on Sundays—it's a daily response to the overflowing joy of knowing that we belong to Christ forever.

This joy also leads us to serve one another, but our service starts in the most immediate and personal place—our homes. In our families, we have the daily opportunity to live out Christ's love by caring for and encouraging one another. Whether it's through patience, forgiveness, or acts of kindness, our homes are the first place we practice a life of service. This is something Christian homes teach from the time the kiddos are quite little, and for good reason. From the context of our homes, our love and care then extend into our church family, where we walk alongside fellow believers in faith.

As Paul reminds us in Galatians 5:13, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." And so, we do; we serve one another. Some of our church family serves through operating the screens during worship services, others provide food for funeral luncheons, many volunteers make time to assist with the financial matters of the church such as counting contributions for deposit, and some even come in to sharpen pew pencils and restock paper. Whatever you choose to do to help your church family, these acts of service are vital for a congregation that thrives.

As we strengthen and encourage one another in our congregation, that service naturally spills over into our community. We become Christ's hands and feet to our neighbors, reaching out with compassion, generosity, and the truth of the Gospel. And beyond our local communities, the joy of the resurrection moves us to engage in the broader mission of the Church—to share the love of Christ with the world.

As a church, we are a family—a resurrection people who live in the light of Christ's victory! Let us continue to walk together in this joy, worshiping wholeheartedly, serving faithfully, and loving one another deeply. May the good news of Easter fill our hearts and lives every single day!


All Ages Welcome! Children and Adults may touch Gideon!




#### E-GIVING



#### Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:
You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are his: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).



If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.


This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.


