Jesus Is Our Good Shepherd

Psalm 23

King James Version (KJV)



- ¹ The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.
- ²He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters.
- ³ He restoreth my soul: He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.
- ⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me.
- ⁵ Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: Thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.
- ⁶ Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

For hundreds of years Psalm 23 has been one of the most treasured passages in all of Holy Scripture. It is among the most familiar, so much so that even people who are not religious or very knowledgeable about the Bible recognize these words!

They are some of the most comforting words from our Lord, often being recited or called to mind in times of trouble or distress, and often being read when people gather together at the loss of a loved one. In addition, we hear Psalm 23 when we gather for worship on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, which is familiarly known as "Good Shepherd Sunday". This year, Good Shepherd Sunday falls on Sunday, May 11th.

The Lutheran Study Bible provides thoughtful insight on this psalm: "In faith, David declares that since the LORD (Yahweh) is His shepherd, he 'shall not want' (v 1). Our Good Shepherd lovingly provides everything that we need in this life, but we often fail to recognize that these gifts come from Him. Instead, we focus on things that we want, but do not need. How wonderful that our Shepherd does not withhold His blessings from us, but still cares for these needs and more: He gives us His own Son!"

- ~ Indeed, in God's holy Word, we are given the assurance that Jesus, our Good Shepherd, gives us everything we need so that we lack nothing.
- ~ Not only does He give us all we need to support this body and life, but also His Word, forgiveness, peace, and eternal life
- ~ He gives you His living water in Baptism and in His Word.
- ~ The Good Shepherd restores your soul. He gives you life again.
- ~ The Good Shepherd guides you along the true path. He keeps you from wandering and gives you His righteousness. He keeps you safe while in death's dark valley.
- ~ He is always with you, in your Baptism, in His Word, and in His Supper.
- ~ The Good Shepherd disciplines and consoles you with His rod and staff, which are His Law and His Gospel of His holy Word.
- ~ He prepares a table for you with His Body and Blood.
- ~ He heals you.
- ~ And yes, Goodness and Mercy are following you all the days of your life!

Jesus, our Good Shepherd says,
"My sheep hear my voice,
and I know them,
and they follow me.
I give them eternal life,
and they will never perish,
and no one will snatch them
out of my hand"
(John 10: 27 - 28).

First Lutheran School Students

Education Fund Scholarships are again open for the 2025-2026 academic year. All First Lutheran Church member families with students enrolled in First Lutheran School are eligible for scholarships. Scholarship awards are based on financial need AND on the amount of available funds from the Edwin & Ella Ponath Education Fund (\$5194.54), Melvin & Marlys Tessmer Tuition Aid Fund (\$572.29), and FLS Scholarship Fund (\$64.06).

Applications are mailed to all member families with students in Kindergarten through Grade 7. (Prospective member students should also apply.)

The application forms are also available from our website www.firstglencoe.org or upon request. Completed applications must be returned by June 16, 2025, in order to be considered for the 2025-2026 academic year.

(Application Deadline June 16)

First Lutheran <u>Tuition Aid</u> may also be available to all students in Grades Kindergarten – 8th Grade. The amount of aid is calculated with a formula based on Adjusted Gross Income (AGI). Please complete the application form on our website <u>www.firstglencoe.org</u> and turn in the page of your tax form 1040 that includes your AGI to the Church/School Office before July 31th.





A very memorable fishing story took place 2000 years ago and is repeated often even to this day since it was recorded in Scripture and included a miraculous intervention. It took place shortly after Christ's resurrection. Peter, for some reason, had a hankering to go fishing and told the other disciples, "I'm going out to fish." The other disciples said, "We'll go with you." and they fished all night and caught nothing.

That must have been a hard, discouraging fishing trip. Anyone who's ever been fishing knows the frustration the disciples experienced in the daily text. Early in the morning Jesus stood on the shore but they were unable to recognize Him, possibly due to a morning mist or because of the distance. He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?" Of course the resurrected Lord knew they hadn't caught anything!

A seasoned fisherman knows that he must cast his reel in all directions to find where the fish are biting. When I'm fishing from a boat I'll try fishing from the back, each side and even the front if I can get there. Surely during the course of the night the disciples had moved about trying to cast their nets in various places in search of fish.

But Jesus had some specific and unusual fishing advice. "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." Now surely they had tried this already but Peter didn't hesitate in responding to the voice in the distance. His obedience resulted in a great catch of 153 large fish. The story concludes around a warm fire as well with the disciples joining Jesus for a seashore breakfast along with some teaching. I have a feeling that those disciples involved in this fishing story talked about it everywhere they went!

It's always been interesting to me that they counted the fish they caught that morning and the total number is included in the Scripture account. What an authenticating detail this is. Real fishermen keep track of how many fish they catch, particularly keepers!

Have you ever worked hard in some form of Christian service and not "caught" anything? We may serve in some form of ministry for Christ

that, at least for a season, seems to be going nowhere. We're not "catching" anything. We don't see receptivity or growth which can be very discouraging. But we need to stay faithful and listen to the voice of our Master and learn from the disciples' fishing trip.

We need to trust and obey. There will be discouraging times and mysterious delays in our service for the Lord. I am sure there was for the disciples and other early followers of our Lord as well. Notable leaders throughout church history had these experiences as well.

When they first met, Jesus had said to Peter and his brother Andrew, "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). Peter indeed became a great fisher of men and in some ways we are all his spiritual descendants. We are all called to be fishers of men.

Stay faithful, the catch is coming!

~ 74th Annual Potato Pancake & Gausage Vinner Summary ~



"THANK YOU" for supporting our 74th Annual Pancake & Sausage Meal on Sunday, March 30, 2025.

Diners enjoyed an all-you-care-to eat spread of potato and regular pancakes, sausages, applesauce, cheese, mint, and beverages. An impressive 750 meals were served, including 39 deliveries and approximately 200 take-outs.

This was made possible by the efforts of 100 dedicated volunteers who worked throughout the event. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the generous donors and discounts received from Alsleben Meats, Dollar Fresh, Edling Potato Farms, Glencoe Co-Op Assn, KWIK Trip, Michael Foods, Seneca Foods, and the Thrivent Action Team Program. Any unused supplies were returned, and the remaining items were donated to FLS for use at lunch.

To enhance our planning, 283 tickets were pre-sold with designated time slots. The busiest dining period was the 11-12 slot, but we have plans for next year to minimize wait times. **We appreciate your patience and understanding.**

In terms of food usage, we utilized an impressive 650 pounds of potatoes and 266 pounds of sausage. All leftover sausages were sold.

The total ticket sales and additional donation monies amounted to \$10,013, while expenses totaled \$2,737. This resulted in a profit of \$7,276. Two Thrivent Action Teams, contributing an additional \$500, also played a vital role in the event.

The profits were evenly distributed between the FLC General Fund and the NYG Youth program.

We are truly grateful to each and every one of you for your participation and support. Thank you to all the congregation and community members who graced us with their presence and enjoyed the delicious food.

The squash was cut in wedges, drizzled with olive oil, sprinkled with salt on top, and baked at 425 degrees for 30 minutes. The wedges are easy to eat and you can even eat the skin! Yummy!


