When I arrived at First Ev. Lutheran Church (FLC) in June of 2012, the thing Pastor Mathison said to me was:

"The Lord Sent you!" I greatly appreciated those words. What's more I am very thankful for the great working relationship that I enjoyed with both Pastor Mathison from 2012 until his retirement in 2016, and with Pastor Adelsen, whom the Lord sent to serve us at FLC from 2017 to 2022.



Now after nearly three years of praying, waiting, and trusting in the Lord, God has answered our prayers and sent Pastorelect Michael Ewert to serve us as our Assistant Pastor. Together we can truly and joyfully say to him, "The Lord sent you!"

In May of this year, Pastor-elect Ewert graduated from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri where he studied for three years plus did one year of Vicarage (internship) in St. Joseph, MO. These include preaching; teaching God's Word to all age groups; conducting Weddings, Funerals, home visits, care center visits; and performing many other duties.

From speaking with Pastor-elect Ewert in person both in April, when I was in St. Louis for the Call Service and in May when I was back in town for the Graduation Services, I know that he is very excited to come to serve us here at FLC and I'm very excited for his arrival.

"The word 'pastor' comes from the Latin word for 'shepherd.' Shepherding is a predominant picture in the Bible for both the work of Christ and the work of our pastors... Pastors model their ministry on the life and work

of the Lord Jesus Christ who did not come to be served, but to serve. The pastoral office is an office of loving, caring service to the people of God, in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ...May God continue to bless the church mightily through His gift of pastors." 936 Sundays: a Stewardship of Time. faith, and formation"

God, in His wisdom and grace, has entrusted parents with a sacred calling: to raise their children in the fear and knowledge of the Lord. One of the most sobering and encouraging realities of parenting is this—on average, you have 936 Sundays between your child's birth and the day they leave home.

That number may sound big at first—but think about how quickly Sundays fly by. A few missed due to illness or vacation. A few more to sports, distractions, or busyness. Suddenly the number shrinks.

Every one of those Sundays is a gift from God. Every single one is an opportunity to bring your child to the Lord's house, to gather as the body of Christ, and to grow together in God's Word.

For some of those Sundays it is also their chance to participate in youth group. Additional instruction and fellowship geared directly toward them, their challenges, and their joys. In our Lutheran confessions it is clear that we believe, teach, and confess that faith is created and strengthened by the means of grace—Word and Sacrament.



That means the single most important place your child can be on Sunday is in God's house, receiving the gifts Christ died to give.

The Church Is a Family: The congregation is not just where we "go to church." It's where we are the Church. As members of one body, we share in the joy and responsibility of raising the next generation of believers.

Our youth group is not simply a social club or an optional extra—it's an extension of the Church's mission. It's a place where your child can connect with peers, wrestle with their faith, serve others, and be mentored by faithful adults in the faith. In a world that is increasingly hostile to Christian truth, our youth need to be deeply rooted in Christ, surrounded by a community that helps them to stand firm.

Encourage, Equip, Engage: As a parent, you are your child's

primary spiritual influence. The Church is here to walk alongside you. But your involvement and encouragement matter immensely. Don't underestimate the power of your example—when your child sees that worship, Bible study, and youth group are priorities in your family life, they'll learn that faith isn't just for Sunday mornings—it's for every day.



A Prayer for Parents:



Lord Jesus, You welcomed the little children and blessed them.

Help me to steward the time I have with my child well.

Keep us faithful in worship, steadfast in the Word, and joyful in the fellowship of believers.

Give me wisdom and courage to encourage my child in the faith and to prioritize the things that matter eternally.

Bless our congregation, our youth, and our leaders, that we may grow together in You. In Your name we pray. Amen.

Practical Ways to Make the Most of Your Sundays:

- Prioritize weekly worship as a non-negotiable family rhythm
- · Attend Sunday School and Bible Class (together when possible)
- · Encourage your child to participate regularly in youth group nights/events
- · Serve together in congregational ministries
- Talk about the sermon or readings over Sunday lunch
- Pray as a family daily—especially on Sunday nights to start the week in Christ

You only get 936 Sundays. Let's use them well —not in fear, but in faith. And trust that God will bless the seeds planted in your child's heart through His Word, His people, and His promises.



The budget as approved by the Church Council will then be presented to the Voters' Assembly. A special Voters' Meeting will be scheduled for budget approval. Additional members to help with the planning for the 150th anniversary of First Lutheran (2026) are requested. Interested members, please let the church office know. The next Nominating Committee membership has been finalized. A revised format for the "measure of our stewardship" that is printed in weekly bulletins was approved.

Christian Education Board | Month of May

The Christian Education Board did not formally meet for the month of May.



PLARN?

Plarn? What is it? Is that even a word? Does it have anything to do with us?



"Plarn" is a blending of the two words "plastic" and "yarn." Plarn is made by cutting and connecting strips of recycled plastic bags into material for crocheting or weaving into usable items.

The Mat-Makers of First Evangelical Lutherans Church make plarn and crochet it into approximately 24" X 6' sleeping mats. The mats are then distributed by Minnesota South District "New Freedom Mission Store" to God's dear, unhoused folks near downtown St. Paul who need a place to sleep.

Mat-Makers come to church the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month to make plarn and crochet mats. There are devotions, a fun roll-call question, laughter, a lot of visiting and refreshments involved. (If Pastor Mathison is present, there is also coffee.) Some of the Mat-Makers choose to make plarn at home for others to crochet into mats.

The Mat-Makers have compiled a list of typical plastic bags and the approximate width needed for crocheting a comfortable mat. If this list would be helpful to you, please pick one up from the church office.

PIG'S EYE LAKE HOMELESS CAMP

"New Freedom Mission Store" is planning a "Mat Saturday" in the Fall. This will be a one-day event where ALL of the mats available will be distributed to the residents of the large Pig's Eye Lake Homeless Camp.

Since First Evangelical Lutheran Mat-Makers are the largest contributor of sleeping mats, the missionaries who do the distributing would VERY MUCH like for some First Evangelical member to accompany them that day so we can actually see how well our mats are received.

It's a rugged area. Lots of walking involved. The missionaries have become friends with the residents and look forward to their visits.

Perhaps you would like to help distribute mats that day?! You don't have to be a Mat- Maker to help distribute mats. In addition to the experienced missionaries, professional social workers and sometimes police enter the camp together.


CHURCH SCREENS ASSISTANCE

HOMEGROWN! IT'S A GOOD THING!

The Farm to School Dept of Ag grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program.

On April 4, we surprised the students with smoothies at lunchtime. The Kemps Yogurt used came from "only MN" dairy cattle. Smoothies are a delicious and easy way to enjoy seasonal berries and local dairy products.

Here's the recipe so you can make them at home:

Berry Delicious Smoothie

2 cups fresh or frozen mixed berries

- 1 cup strawberry yogurt
- 1 sliced banana
- 1 cup milk



In a blender, combine all ingredients and blend until smooth. Pour into glasses and serve – Yields 4 servings



On April 10, our lunch featured a Sausage Egg Bake. Eggs were from Michael Foods leftover from Pancake Event, Pork Sausage from Brownton Meat Market, Tomatoes and Onions from the School Garden. Eggs are

incredibly nutritious and delicious. Pork is an excellent source of protein containing iron, zinc, and vitamin B. The Onions and Tomatoes add flavor, vitamins, and some pretty color.

We also enjoyed Rhubarb muffins made with Rhubarb frozen for us by Sharon Schauer. Did you know that Rhubarb is a vegetable and not a fruit? Our dessert was a fan favorite



 yogurt parfait with strawberries and Granola (Yogurt from Kemps/MN Dairy, and Strawberries

from Steven Schauer's garden). We were absolutely delighted that we had a few students who ate everything on their plate!

Finding complete meals that most students will eat is always a challenge. We encourage students to at least try and taste everything on their plate. Our goal is to eliminate food waste while serving Minnesota foods that are nutritious and tasty, Suggestions for meal ideas and recipes are always appreciated.



On April 30, Italian Dunkers were served. they were made with ground beef from the Brownton Meat Market (only MN beef)! This entre' is a student favorite!

In May, we filled in for two lunch days while Gina Mackenthun was away. It was exhausting and we do not know how Gina handles lunch by herself day after day, all year long!

We also had issues with dishwasher drainage - thank you to Loren Engelmann and Custodian Andy Danielson for working to resolve this issue!



On May 8, we baked a yummy French Toast dish using liquid eggs from Michael Foods in Gaylord. We also served Cheese Sticks from Bongards Creamery and Zucchini Bread made with Zucchini from the School Garden.

On May 9, we cooked up a delicious Chicken Pasta Bake utilizing Bongards Cheese. The students also again enjoyed Berry Smoothies made with Kemps Yogurt (local dairies) and Strawberries from Steven Schauer's garden.


