

"Community: We Are Not Alone"

"I'm a spiritual person, but I'm not religious." Have you ever heard someone say that? Maybe you have had the same thought yourself. Today, many people feel that no organized religion empowers them to be healthy, renewed, or growing human beings—or even Christians! To them, rituals and organizations found in churches are more or less empty shells.



These kinds of observations may be well-meant as one seeks a **deeper relationship with God** from **our** point of view. After all, we all think of ourselves as the center of

the world. We like to choose what is best for ourselves.



So, we tend to look for a god who may satisfy our desires and wishes. If the Christian God doesn't deliver or meet our specifications, we seek another option to support and cultivate our own "spirituality." Further, in a

religiously diverse environment, Christians even routinely switch denominational affiliations. They float around, attempting to find a place that they can call home.

Jesus says: "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). Our new Bible Study called "Community: We Are Not Alone" will expound a Lutheran conviction that we **do** have abundant life given in the Church. Lutherans confess in Article VII of the Augsburg Confession that **the Church is the assembly of all**



believers "in which the Gospel is purely taught and the Sacraments are correctly administered." It answers the questions: "Where is the Church?" and "Where can I find a church home?" Lutherans confess that a true Church is not measured by "my taste" or "my sincerest spirituality"; rather, the Church is where our crucified and risen Lord Jesus lives and gives His abundant gifts.

Jesus, who showed His love at Calvary, bids you come to His Church. Connected with Him, our lives will ever be "full of sap and green" (Psalm 92:14). Discover the richness and joy that is found in the Lord's Church alone and the life that is lived there together as Christians in community.





For 149 years, First Ev. Lutheran Church of Glencoe has been a community of Christians gathered where by God's grace the Gospel is purely taught and the

Sacraments correctly administered. As we prepare to celebrate our 150th Anniversary next year, it is especially appropriate that we have this study, "Community: We Are Not Alone."


About Our New Assistant Pastor, Michael Ewert

~ Summaries from the Council and Boards ~



Church Council | June 11th

The Church Council reviewed, discussed, and approved the available minutes from each of the individual Boards at the June 11th meeting. Church Council had planned to work on the proposed budget; but due to extended medical leave of responsible staff, budget updates and corrections were not available. A Special Voters' Assembly to approve this fiscal year's budget (previously planned for late June) was therefore tabled at this time.

Christian Education Board | June 2nd

The Christian Board discussed the Summer Flames Program and updated the Cradle Roll. Sunday School options were considered and Parade plans were revealed. Vacation Bible School needs were anticipated and ideas were expanded. Budgetary concerns were addressed and the meeting was adjourned.

Day School | June 4th

Planning for next school year is already underway. We have our new Principal, Mr. Perry Miller, starting on July 1st. We are still looking to fill the first grade teaching position. There are summer camps being offered to students throughout the summer. The Future Flames Committee is hosting a Seafood Boil on July 18th in New Auburn.

Board of Deacons | June 3rd

Board finalizing the 2025-2026 budget. Finalizing plans to welcome Pastor Elect Ewert. Reviewed Pastor's vacation plans and coverage. Planning to assess church office staff PCs for potential update/replacement.

Board of Evangelism | June 4th

The Evangelism Board finalized the visitor bags which were placed at the Welcome Center. We continued discussing plans for the KDUZ Lutheran Hour Event which will be Sept 27, 2025. We discussed the possibility of hosting an event, like Bingo, in August.



Here is a little bit of "25 years ago" news

1,724 Hand-Crafted Gift Crosses





In the cross of Christ I glory, Tow'ring o'er the wrecks of time. All the light of sacred story Gathers round its head sublime.

It was 25 years ago that First Evangelical Lutheran Church dedicated the "new" 2000 addition. It included the Fellowship Center and adjoining kitchen, a lovely south entry way, a new office complex and four First Lutheran day school classrooms and lockers. Whew! It served us well then and is still serving us well today.

During the dedication of that addition attendees received a worship folder AND a hand-crafted gift cross. The committee requested members to help make crosses. "They can be crocheted, tatted, knitted, plastic canvas, hardanger or ANY way you can make a small cross." The committee hoped to receive several hundred crosses and were privately concerned what to do with them if only a few showed up.

Well, First Evangelical stitchers did not have to be asked twice! So many came in they were hard to count. Stitchers were asked to leave their crosses, their name and the number of crosses made. Most did, but many did not. They wanted to be anonymous. Yet the crosses just kept showing up. By far the largest number of crosses were crocheted.



When the woes of life o'ertake me, Hope deceive and fears annoy, Never shall the cross forsake me; Lo, it glows with peace and joy.

The final count was 1724. Here is a list of the known contributors. Most are members. Some are friends of the congregation who heard about it and asked to participate.

Praise God from Whom all blessings flow for all of these dear stitchers, many of whom are now praising God in their heavenly homes. There were many more crosses than needed for the day of dedication. The pastors and staff found ways to use them. Each confirmand received a cross that year. Pastors took them along to shut-in visits. New members and visitors received a cross.



When the sun of bliss is beaming Light and love along the way, From the cross the radiance streaming Adds more luster to the day.

And now, a request from YOU! Did you receive a cross that day? What did you do with it? Did you save it? Is it now in your Bible? Did you give it away? Did it fade? (Crochet thread often fades over time.) Phone or email the church office. We would like to track what happened to your cross.

Baptismal Gift Blanket



Did you know? When a child is baptized at FLC, he or she receives a beautiful flannel blanket, that is made by the Quilting Group.

For each blanket, two complimentary flannel fabrics are purchased, washed, and pressed. Then three or four of the quilters get together to layout, cut, and place the fabrics. It is then sewn and stitched together.

The completed blanket then goes to "The Temple Service Center" in Glencoe where the words FIRST LUTHERAN SCHOOL are embroidered onto the blanket.

This is then gifted to the baptized child, compliments of the Day School Board.

As Christians, we know the destination for all of us; we need to remember to treasure the journey.



Rooted in Christ, Growing in Stewardship

The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life! Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor. To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymp!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, May we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

- The tree of faith is not planted in us by us. It is the Spirit's work! We do not claim the title "steward." Rather, we are created for it (Gen. 1:26–28).
- He is the One who makes it grow in us. The fruits of the Spirit are borne out because we, by grace through faith, are connected to the vine that is Jesus (John 15).

Laden branches freely bearing Gifts the Giver loves to bless; Here is fruit that grows by sharing, Patience, kindness, gentleness.

- Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.
- But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, Teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

- Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.
- This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, May we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

- Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.
- The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!






