of the Declaration of Independence. Many plans are already underway for a series of meaningful events and activities leading up to the big day of July 4<sup>th</sup> when our nation officially turns 250-years-old.



What is the goal of these celebrations? According to whitehouse.gov/america250: It is for all Americans "to have a renewed love of American history, experience the beauty of our country, and ignite a spirit of adventure and innovation that will raise our nation to new heights over the next 250 years." Hopefully that will happen! Indeed, we are truly blessed by God to live in this country where among many of our liberties and rights is the freedom to worship the One true God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

Next year here at First Lutheran, and most especially on

July 12<sup>th</sup> of 2026, we will be thanking our gracious God for 150 years together as a congregation of His people in this place. We will do our fair share of celebrating, too!



Plans are already underway to make these series of events exciting and faith-building.

I have a friend who shows his "love of American history" (see above) by re-reading the Declaration of Independence every July 4<sup>th</sup>. That is commendable. I have also heard of others who love their country so much that they keep a small copy of the U.S. Constitution readily available as a handy reference to study.

While I admit that I don't re-read our church's Constitution every year, we all do have ready access to it on our church's website <u>firstglencoe.org/about/churchdocuments/</u>. There in our church's Constitution, which is formally known as the "Articles of Incorporation", the first two articles tell us two very important items, namely, who we are and what we are doing here:

#### **ARTICLE I NAME**

"The name of this congregation shall be: First Evangelical Lutheran Church of Glencoe."

#### **ARTICLE II PURPOSE**

"The purpose of this congregation shall be to seek the honor and glory of God,

to carry out His will,

to manifest the unity of our faith in Jesus Christ as God and Savior,

to spread the kingdom of God and to foster Christian fellowship and love,

by the preaching of the Word of God, by the administration of the Sacraments, and by the religious instruction of all its members, according to the confessional standard of the Evangelical Lutheran Church."

By the grace of God that is what we have been doing at First Ev. Lutheran for nearly 150 years. My prayer to God and my encouragement to you is that we will continue to 'carry out His will, manifest the unity of our faith in Jesus Christ, spread God's kingdom and foster Christian fellowship and love, by sharing God's Word and Sacraments' for the benefit of the Glencoe community until Lord Jesus returns on the Last Day!

Recently Pastor Ewert, Deaconess Polzin, and I sat down together to study God's Word and look for guidance for our upcoming 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations. We found verses from Hebrews chapter 10 to be especially meaningful. What I didn't realize at the time is just how similar the words of Hebrews 10:23-25 are to Article II of our Constitution (see above):

<sup>23</sup> Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup> And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, <sup>25</sup> not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the (Last) Day drawing near.


(Heb. 10:23-25).

want to spend my first few newsletters sharing some of the insights and things I learned from seminary with

you all. I hope that this will deepen our connection and help you understand how I have been shaped and prepared to serve you in ministry.

The first thing I want to share with you starts at the beginning of Jesus' ministry. We read in Mark 1 the account of Jesus calling Simon and Andrew. The very first thing Jesus says to



these disciples is, "Come, follow me." The last thing Jesus says to Peter is, "Follow me." (John 21:19) Jesus bookends discipleship with this call. To be a disciple is to receive the call of Jesus: "Follow me." We receive this call in Baptism as infants for many of us, but for others it is through the proclamation of the Word that we receive this call. Sometimes we are tempted to put the Disciples on a pedestal and think of how different we are from them, but you and I have received the same call from Jesus: "Follow me."

In one of my seminary classes, a professor directed us to Mark 1 and asked a simple question. He asked us, "What is the goal of being a Christian?" We gave many different answers, and I'm sure you can think of many too, but none of them were what he was looking for. He returned us to this call of Jesus, "Follow me."

I find this profound for two reasons:

**First**, it is simple; to be a Christian is to follow Jesus, to follow His Words, and to follow His deeds. Life can feel complicated. We face so many choices and ask, 'What should I do?' Then we hear Jesus' answer: "Follow me." It removes the burden we feel in trying to make the right decision.

**Secondly**, it returns us to our foundation: Jesus Himself, crucified, risen, and calling us to follow. We follow not to earn salvation, but because we have been claimed by Him. We often take for granted that we're following Jesus just because we're Christian. When we return to our call, it snaps us back to our Savior. Jesus is our foundation for everything we do and everything we are. Sometimes we focus more on what we've built: our doctrinal systems, our traditions, our church-isms, even our own sins, rather than on the foundation Himself: Jesus.

We can too easily lose sight of Him. So we remember Jesus' call to us, "Follow me." Just as Jesus called the disciples to follow him, we too have been called. May our lives ever reflect Jesus as we follow Him.







"Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift" (2 Cor. 9:15)! This is St. Paul's exclamation upon hearing the Corinthian church's response to the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and his request for support for the church in Jerusalem. The Christians in Corinth heard and received God's mercy in Christ, and they responded to St. Paul's call to support Christians in Jerusalem with a collection. Their joy filled Jerusalem's need.

<u>This is the reality of stewardship.</u> Because of God's generosity in the giving of His Son to die on the cross for us, we are to be generous with all that we receive from Him. What do we receive? Everything. All that we are and all that we have is the Lord's. He is the creator and the giver. We are His creatures and those who receive what He gives.

It sounds easy. And it is. But then again it isn't. <u>Stewardship is easy because it is God's work.</u> Through what God gives, we give to others. Through what God gives, we support the work of the church for the life of the world. He gives; we receive. And like our generous Father in Heaven, we, as His children, use what He gives to us to love and serve others.

<u>But stewardship is also difficult.</u> That is because it goes against our natural inclination to think that what I have is mine to do what I want with. This is our sinful nature. It is our selfishness and our greed. How can we who have been given everything — life, food, clothing, house, home, forgiveness, divine sonship, an eternal inheritance — be so stingy with what we give to the church, the place where we hear about and receive all that God gives us and does for us? We are all guilty of this kind of thinking. And the only godly response is to repent and trust in the Gospel.

For if God has given you His own Son, will He not give you all things? Yes! This is His sure and certain promise. God provides for His people. He provides everything we need for this body and life and for the coming life.

The church is a mercy place. It's a place where God's mercy in the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ, is given and received. For us who believe it means forgiveness, life and salvation in the face of sin, death and the power of the devil. Here in the church, we inhale God's mercy in Word and Sacrament, and exhale this same mercy in love and service to our neighbor. And that is an enduring, joyful thing to do. Our joy fills our neighbor's need because His joy filled ours (Heb. 12:2). Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift!




