His hand. Your eternal life is now certain.



"Searched for and Found by the Good Shepherd"

The Good Shepherd stands as the crowds flock to Him. As the Gospel writer Luke describes it, there are two very different groups that come together to see and to listen to Jesus that day (Luke 15:1-2). On the one hand, a flock of Pharisees stands aloof, watching this Shepherd, Jesus to see what He does. On the other hand, there's a group of people with very bad reputations; tax collectors and sinners. They're the undesirables. Pharisees and tax collectors- you'll never find two groups more opposite than these, but both have something in common, they're both lost sheep in need of a shepherd. So, Jesus begins with this parable:

<sup>4</sup> "What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? <sup>5</sup> And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. <sup>6</sup> And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' <sup>7</sup> Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance." (Luke 15:4-7)

That's one **dedicated** Shepherd! When a single sheep is discovered to be lost, He leaves the other 99 and goes after it. Sheep don't last long on their own; they'll either eat the

wrong plants or get gobbled up by a predator. With no sense of direction, they're not going to find their way back to the Shepherd, so the Shepherd has to go to them. And notice how the story continues: Once the Shepherd finds the sheep, He carries it home. When He arrives home, He holds a **party**- maybe a **meal**- to rejoice that the lost sheep is found.



So, Jesus tells the crowd what His mission is. He isn't there to save people who don't need salvation. He's there to save the lost. He hasn't come to die for those who don't need forgiveness, but to redeem those who do. And when a sinner repents by the grace of God, even the angels in heaven rejoice. And we rejoice right along with them that Jesus, the Good Shepherd Who comes to seek and to save the lost, has searched for and found us, too!

When you come to the Divine Service on Sunday mornings, you have answered the Good Shepherd's call to gather **YOU** in. As you confess your sins, angels rejoice over your confession. Why? Because the angels always rejoice in the work of Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd. He has carried our sin and unworthiness to the cross. He defeated it there. So that He may bear you on His shoulders to heaven, He has borne your cross and paid that price. He has found you, saved you, and now feeds and tends to you by His Word and Sacraments. Nothing can snatch you out of

BUT BE CAREFUL THAT YOU DON'T WANDER AWAY AGAIN FROM YOUR SHEPHERD. Sometimes Christians will grow tired of the Lord's heavenly feast of Word and Sacrament, and they simply stop coming to church. But, sheep that wander away quickly stop being part of the flock. If you isolate yourself from the Lord's means of grace, you are depriving yourself of His forgiveness. You're also filling yourself with other things, other thoughts and teachings, that cannot save. It makes you easy



prey for the devil who prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Just as there's many wrong paths to take in a corn maze, so there are **many** ways to be lost in the wilderness of this world, because the gate is wide, and the path is broad that leads to destruction.

But this is not you when you heed the Good Shepherd's voice calling out to you. Your Good Shepherd faithfully gathers you here, to His flock. He has led you by the still waters of your Baptism. He says, "I have called you by name and placed My Name on you. You are not lost, because I have found you." He speaks His Word to you,



and by that Word He continues to forgive you your sins and strengthen your faith. When you are spooked by prowling anxiety or doubt....... the Shepherd's Word of grace still holds true...... you are His ......even if you don't necessarily feel it! And as Jesus ate with those tax collectors and sinners, so He invites you to His meal: He gives you His body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins.

So, together in the Divine Service, you and I can rejoice with the angels and archangels over the repentance Jesus has given to you and me! Jesus, your Good Shepherd rose again so that by His Word and Sacraments He has found you!


# Blessings as we enter the month of September!

# From the DCE Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Synod has recognized what many of us already feel in our own congregations—our youth need Christ-centered encouragement and support in an ever-changing world. Because of this, the LCMS is developing a new Youth Ministry Initiative, guided by the research presented in 7 Practices of Healthy Youth Ministry by Julianna Shults and Mark Kiessling.

I have been asked to serve as a regional consultant for this effort, and I am grateful for the opportunity. My role will be to walk alongside congregations as they assess their youth ministry—celebrating areas of strength while also identifying opportunities for growth. The framework comes from the seven proven practices that foster long-term, healthy youth ministry.

The heart of this initiative is twofold: (1) to recognize and strengthen practices already bearing fruit, and (2) to identify areas where unhealthy patterns may hinder the mission. As a consultant I will then suggest options for improvement and resources to assist in doing so. Think of it as providing tools, encouragement, and direction so that, together as the Body of Christ, we can ensure the Gospel is faithfully passed on to the next generation.

Why is this work so vital? Because the challenges our young people face are real—pressures from peers, temptations from the world, and doubts fueled by a culture often opposed to Christ. Yet God's Word does not change. His promises remain firm. In Baptism, each young person is claimed by Christ, and our calling as parents, pastors, teachers, deaconesses, DCEs, and mentors is to nurture that faith through Word and Sacrament, prayer, and Christ-centered community.

This Synod-wide effort is not meant to replace the faithful ministry already happening locally, but to strengthen and support it. Imagine a future where congregations know and apply best practices, where youth leaders are encouraged and equipped, and where our young people have meaningful opportunities to worship, serve, and confess Christ boldly.

As this initiative continues to take shape, I invite you to pray—for our Synod leaders, for the 15-20 consultants (including myself), for congregations, and especially for our young people. Pray that the Lord would raise up faithful servants to guide and encourage them. Pray that our own congregation might use these resources to reach and nurture youth even more effectively. And above all, pray that through it all, the name of Jesus would be praised.

Together we echo the words of Psalm 71:17–18 (ESV): "O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds. So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come."

# ~ Summaries from the Council and Boards ~



## Church Council | August 19th

The Church Council reviewed, discussed, and approved the available minutes from each of the individual Boards at the August 19<sup>th</sup> meeting. Protocols were reviewed to remind committees and boards of requirements as outlined in the bylaws and Voter's resolutions. Computers will be evaluated to determine what is needed to upgrade to Windows 11. 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee ideas and activities were reviewed. Discussed the business manager resignation and how duties are being managed currently. Evaluation is being carried out to determine optimal options going forward.

## Christian Education Board | August 11th

Cradle Roll was updated. Sunday School Program was reviewed. Helpers are needed. Sunday School Christmas Service is Dec. 10 at the 10:30 a.m. service. Heifer International will be our offering designation with a probable goal of purchasing goats. We will not be having a Sunday Carnival but instead just a sign-up with a treat bag being given out. Church Busy Bag updates were given. We briefly discussed VBS. Nominations for next year's members were shared.

#### Day School | August 7th

Plans are underway for the start of the 2025-2026 school year. Mr. Miller updated the board on updates done for the upcoming school year. Education Sunday is September 7, 2025. Mr. Perry Miller will be installed as our principal then.

#### Board of Deacons | August 7th

Board reviewed deacon/elder and fellowship schedules. Reviewed plans for the new confirmation year. Reviewed the 2026 worship schedule. Reviewed and approved Pastor Ewert's request for Post Seminary Applied learning.

# Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The 'Farm to School' Department of Agriculture grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our school lunch program.

Another School year has begun, Fall is approaching, and garden harvest is in full swing. Tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, squash, and pumpkins are ready for picking during this time. Soon the first frost will threaten.






Additionally, fruits like apples and pears are ready for harvest. Beyond just picking the last of the warm-season crops, September is also a crucial time for fall planting and season extension. This is a good month to sow cool-season vegetables like kale, spinach, radishes,

beets, broccoli, and various leafy greens. September is a mix of harvesting, preserving, and planting.

The Farmers Market in Glencoe is open every Thursday from 3 PM to 6 PM at the City Center Parking Lot. year, they began promoting a program called POP (Power of Produce Club). The POP Club is for children ages 2-14. During designated POP market dates (Sept. 4, Sep.t 18, Oct. 2), children receive a \$2 token to spend on fresh fruits and vegetables from local growers. It's easy to sign up at the Market and immediately start your purchases with the tokens.




September Homegrown meals at FLS will include sweet corn, melons, and zucchini.

Novelli was the president of the VII Hispanic National Convention and the Hispanic Missionary League (2018-2022), and collaborates with different missional efforts and Lutheran agencies in the U.S.










# In 2026, First Ev. Lutheran Church will reach a significant milestone – it's 150th Anniversary!


# Parent/Catechumen Info Night: September 3rd at 7pm in the Church Fellowship Center
