### From Assistant Pastor, Michael Ewert

Philippians 2:3-5 "3. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. 4. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus."

I recently saw this decision tree chart online and it really helped me to visualize my role. I have already learned a great deal in the past five months here at First Lutheran, and I am confident that I will continue to learn.

But, one of the things that is a bigger focus is making the proper decisions when faced with multiple options. Something I have faced at times is paralysis by analysis. I freeze up as I spend too much time trying to decide what is the right choice rather than actually making a decision.

I find this chart helpful for three reasons, it is practical, sympathetic, and thinks about the results. I know I will have to make many decisions, and I will sometimes make the wrong one.

This chart breaks down the decision -making process into three main phases: information, consequence and implementation. It asks if I have all the necessary information or if there are ways to get more info. It then directs the user to make a decision as proper. But, then if I do

not have the right information it asks what will the consequences be if I make the wrong decision? Finally, if I don't have the info and there are serious consequences, how soon do I have to implement the decision? If I have time wait, if not make the decision. There is one theme that is throughout the entire chart no matter the result, learn. If I make a good decision learn from it, if I make the wrong decision, learn from it.

Just as Solomon advises in Proverbs 11:2, "When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with the humble is wisdom." I know I have a lot to learn, and so I am thankful for your patience as I continue to grow in humility and in the way of the Lord. God's blessings as we enter the season of Advent.



### ~Summaries from Our Boards~

#### Church Council | November 20th

The Church Council reviewed, discussed, and approved the available November minutes from each of the individual Boards at the November 20th meeting. Jim Chapa, financial consultant, reviewed financial reports, trends and answered Council members' questions. Expenditures are continuing to be greater than member contributions. Plans for "bridging the gap" in funding needs were discussed. Recommendations from Council that will be brought to the Voters' 12/1/25 meeting include applying for a Line of Credit through Lutheran Church Extension Fund, using Perpetual General Fund Debt Reduction Funds when needed to meet required expenditures, and applying staff step increases retroactively to July 1, 2025 (start of the fiscal year).

### Christian Education Board | November 10th

Christian Education Board members reviewed and discussed 'Trunk or Treat,' Sunday School Christmas Service, Cradle Roll, 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary t-shirt, Christmas Ornament, Advent Meals on Dec. 3 & 10, 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Plans, Attendance at various youth groups, and Fellowship Hour on Dec. 14. New items discussed included Baptismal Gifts, Thanksgiving Craft (We decided not to do it this year.), Easter Egg Hunt, and a party for men, similar to the Ladies ParTEA.



## Homegrown! It's a Good Thing!

The 'Farm to School' Department of Agriculture grant monies are used to purchase locally grown and raised foods (beef, pork, poultry, eggs, vegetables, fruits) for our First Lutheran School lunch program.

Those with garden bounty continue to enjoy stored squash, potatoes, cabbage, carrots, and apples! It is so rewarding to continue eating produce from the garden long after it's been harvested!

Our November Homegrown meal was held on Nov. 6. First Lutheran School students enjoyed a Charcuterie Meal of Summer Sausage, Dried Beef, Pepper Stick, Deviled



Eggs, Cheeses, Crackers, Carrot & Celery Sticks, Apple Slices, and Pumpkin Bars! They discovered a new word that day, learning that **Charcuterie** is a French word.

The meats were from the Brownton Meat Market and all made from local **Beef**. The Deviled **Eggs** were made from eggs from the Doug Schultz farm. Two kinds of **Cheese** (Cheddar and Pepperjack) came from the Bongards Creamery, all from the milk of local cows. The **Carrot** sticks were from Tangletown Gardens in Plato. Students learned that carrots are a root vegetable that can be stored in a cool spot and kept all throughout the winter to use! The **Apples** from Shimanski Orchards in Silver Lake were delicious and full of Vitamins C, K, and B-complex. The Pumpkin Cake, utilized **Pumpkin** preserved by Mrs. Donnay, from her sister's garden. Many of the students had recently carved pumpkins and so were familiar with pumpkin innards!
